Rehmet is the Texas State Council of Machinists, The International Association of Machinists and Aerospace Workers in the state of Texas (part of the AFL-CIO). Rehmet's focus is making it easier to unionize in Texas. "I want to start making, you know, strides in our working conditions here in Texas and and, you know, we're union, we're low density and union here in the state. And I want to try and, you know, legislate ways to increase that make it easier to unionize here in Texas, because I have personally benefited from, you know, a union." _____ 34

Rehmet really does not understand how a private sector business operates. He says that if *he* owned a business, he would be "proactive" and make contact with a union and "say, hey, you know, I want my guys represented" but admits they won't do that because "it's not in their best interest." _____ 37

Rehmet is endorsed by his union, an AFL-CIO affiliate. Rehmet reported a \$5,000 contribution from Machinist Non-Partisan Political League. The "nonpartisan" political arm of the International Association of Machinists and Aerospace Workers contributes 97% to democrats at the federal level. In Texas, the Machinists gave \$25,000 to Fair Shot Texas, a PAC that got nearly a quarter million from the Soros-backed Texas Majority PAC. _____ 39

Rehmet continued: "if our property taxes are high, but we're not taxing hemp, guess what? I think we could, could maybe help out our property tax people with some hemp taxation." _____ 49

Rehmet referred to himself as a "disabled veteran" during an August 2025 podcast, a claim that he has conspicuously omitted from all of his campaign materials. _____ 51

Rehmet solicited contributions before the "FEC deadline." Rehmet is running for state senate and the Federal Election Commission has nothing to do with his campaign reporting. ____ 56

Rehmet referred to the "culture war" as "nonsense" and criticized Rep. Nate Schatzline (then a declared candidate for SD 9) for focusing on those issues. In August 2025, Rehmet told liberal podcasters he would oppose any restrictions on abortion that came to the Texas Senate and that "as a man, I have, you know, really no business telling a woman what she can or cannot do. That's between her and her doctor. That's how I feel." _____ 58

January 2025: Rehmet is charged with "fail to pay toll" in Denton County, a misdemeanor.
August 2025: "And, you know, I know a really big thing also is the tolls in Senate District nine

are crazy. The tolls, they're predatory. Okay? It's, it's insane. So these are a lot of the issues. I mean, I don't care what side of aisle you're on, we all know that these things suck and they need to change." _____ 61

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

The Texas State Council of Machinists recently held a meeting in Austin bringing together delegates from all corners of the state creating a platform for in-depth discussions on a plethora of issues critical to the labor community. - ◆ Allred voted against H.R. 734 - **The Protection of Women and Girls in Sports Act**. The Act would prohibit biological males from participating in school athletic programs meant for biological females.

- Allred voted **AGAINST** the Secure the Border Act.
- Allred voted **AGAINST** denouncing the Biden Administration's immigration policies.

- Allred proudly [touted](#) support from an anti-police group.
- [Attended](#) an event where attendees were given out cards with instructions on evading ICE.
- Allred voted [AGAINST](#) the POLICE Act, which would immediately deport any illegal alien who assaults a law enforcement officer.
- In 2020, Allred [voted](#) for H.R. 7120, the George Floyd Justice in Policing Act, which was co-signed by Pelosi and could restrict federal funding for local police departments that do not comply, and would end qualified immunity.
- In 2020, Allred [refused](#) to comment on calls to defund the police even as the Dallas City Council voted to cut \$7m in overtime benefits for officers.

◆ On abortion:

- Allred voted [against](#) the Born-Alive Abort Survivors Protection Act of 2023, a bill that would require a health practitioner to “exercise the same degree of care as would reasonably be provided to any other child born alive at the same age.”
- Allred voted [against](#) the Providing Medical Care for Newborns Who Survive an Abortion, which would provide life-saving care for newborn babies who survived an abortion.

Qualifications

You must register to vote in the county in which you reside.

You must be a citizen of the United States.

You must be at least 17 years and 10 months old to register, and you must be 18 years of age by Election Day.

You must not be finally convicted of a felony, or if you are a felon, you must have completed all of your punishment, including any term of incarceration, parole, supervision, period of probation, or you must have received a pardon.

You must not have been determined by a final judgment of a court exercising probate jurisdiction to be totally mentally incapacitated or partially mentally incapacitated without the right to vote.

All voters who register to vote in Texas must provide a Texas driver's license number or personal identification number issued by the Texas Department of Public Safety. If you don't have such a number, simply provide the last four digits of your social security number. If you don't have a social security number, you need to state that fact. Your voter registration will become effective 30 days after it is received or on your 18th birthday, whichever is later. - ◆ “Texas Senate District 9 Special Election Candidates Speak on THC, Gambling, Top Priorities” (*The Texan*, [08/01/2025](#))
- ◆ What do you think makes Senate District (SD) 9 unique?

Rehmet: Senate District 9 sits at the crossroads of where Texas has been and where it’s going. It’s where the engines of industry meet the quiet dignity of small towns, where innovation collides with tradition, and where working families are fighting like hell to hold the line. What makes this district unique is that it embodies the full complexity of Texas, urban sprawl, rural grit, economic power, and political urgency. It’s a district with no time for performative politics, only real challenges that demand real solutions. And in this moment, SD 9 has the chance to do something extraordinary: to flip the script, reject the extremists, and prove that bold, working-class leadership still wins in Texas.

- ◆ As a candidate in the special election to fill Senate District 9, what do you think are the top three issues facing the district? Please explain each.

Rehmet: Fully Funding Public Education: Our schools are under attack. Teachers are underpaid, classrooms are under-resourced, and extremist politicians are pushing voucher scams to bleed our public schools dry. - ◆ What makes you uniquely suited to represent District 9 in the Texas Senate?

Rehmet: I've lived the same struggles as the people I'm running to represent. I'm a machinist by trade, a union president, and an Air Force veteran. I've clocked in on factory floors, working on B-52 Bombers. I've fought for better wages and safer working conditions and I've sat at the bargaining table when no one else would stand up. I know what it's like to work a full-time job and still feel like you're falling behind. As president of the Texas State Council of Machinists, I lead one of the largest [International Association of Machinists and Aerospace Workers (IAM)] coalitions in the state, representing more than 30,000 hardworking men and women. I've gone toe-to-toe with corporate greed and walked away with real wins for working families. I've fought back against corporate greed and won tangible victories for working families. I've also seen how politicians in Austin treat folks like us. Far too often we are treated like we're disposable — like we don't belong at the table. I'm not a career politician or a trust fund baby playing dress-up in a suit and tie. I'm the guy who's had to fix planes, fight the bosses, and figure it out with my sleeves rolled up. That perspective matters because the Texas Senate needs someone who knows what it means to serve and who's never forgotten where he comes from.

- ◆ Please name three endorsements you have received that you'd like to highlight.

Rehmet: International Association of Machinists and Aerospace Workers, Rep. Chris Turner (D-Arlington), and Sen. Roland Gutierrez (D-San Antonio).

◆ What is your position on the THC proposal currently being handled in the Legislature?

Rehmet: If Dan Patrick really cared about protecting children from “harmful substances,” he’d be just as eager to pull alcohol from the shelves as he is to ban hemp and THC. If he gave a damn about their well-being, he wouldn’t have stood by while Greg Abbott slashed funding for summer meals that fed hungry kids. Dan Patrick can spare me the hypocrisy. The same party that screams about small government suddenly wants to play morality police. And they’re willing to destroy small businesses, wipe out Texas hemp farmers, and kill an entire industry to do it. Senate Bill (SB) 5 is simply a worse version of SB 3, pushed by culture warriors who are out of touch with everyday Texans. It won’t make us safer but it will put people out of work, it will shutter small businesses and it will hurt veterans. This isn’t about public health, it’s about control. Dan Patrick is the biggest buzzkill in Texas.

◆ What is your position on the expansion of gambling in Texas?

Rehmet: I’m not opposed to the expansion and heavy regulation of gambling in Texas, but let me be clear, not a single penny of public money, like subsidies or tax breaks, should go to casinos or resorts until every public school in Texas is fully funded. Our teachers are paying out of pocket for basic supplies while billion-dollar resort developers line up for handouts. That’s backwards. Before we even think about sweetening the deal for gambling interests, we need to make Texas the national leader in teacher pay. We need to give our educators the tools and support they need, not bury them under bureaucracy and blame. And if these casinos and resorts do come, they better come with living wages, strong benefits, and protections for the workers who keep them running. No poverty-wage jobs, no broken promises. That includes protecting veterans. Too many come home to a system that forgets them. We’ve got veterans in this state sleeping on the streets while billionaires cash out tax breaks. If we’re going to expand gambling, that revenue better go toward housing veterans, cutting red tape for benefits, and making sure they get the care and dignity they’ve earned. Economic development should lift up the communities it lands in, not extract from them. If you want to do business in Texas, you’d better be ready to take care of Texas workers, Texas kids, and Texas veterans first.

◆ Why do you want to serve in the Texas Senate?


Rehmet: I'm running for the Texas Senate because I'm tired of watching the same people get left behind. I've spent my life fighting for working families, on the shop floor, at the bargaining table, and in the streets when we had to. I didn't grow up dreaming of politics. I grew up watching my neighbors struggle to make rent, choosing between prescriptions and groceries, and praying the AC wouldn't go out in the middle of a Texas summer. I served this country in the Air Force because I believed in the promise of democracy and I'm running now because that promise is being broken every damn day by politicians who treat public office like a game. I want to serve because I know what it means to fight for something bigger than myself. And right now, Texas needs fighters. Everyday Texans need people who won't sell out, won't back down and won't forget who they work for. I'm not joining the Senate to play politics. I'm running to kick the doors in for the people who've never had a seat at the table.

◆ Will you impose a term limit on yourself?

Rehmet: Yes, I will impose a term limit on myself and will introduce legislation to make term limits the law. I'm not running to make a career out of politics. I'm running to do the damn work required at this moment, deliver results, and make room for new leaders to step up. This seat belongs to the people of SD 9, not to me or any one person. I believe in public service, not self-preservation.

Rehmet is the Texas State Council of Machinists, The International Association of Machinists and Aerospace Workers in the state of Texas (part of the AFL-CIO). Rehmet's focus is making it easier to unionize in Texas. "I want to start making, you know, strides in our working conditions here in Texas and and, you know, we're union, we're low density and union here in the state. And I want to try and, you know, legislate ways to increase that make it easier to unionize here in Texas, because I have personally benefited from, you know, a union."

- ◆ During an episode of the "Grassroots Resistance" podcast in August 2025, Rehmet was asked why voters should choose him for Senate District 9 and his response was centered on using the legislature to expand labor unions in Texas.





- ◆ Rehmet got involved in the union after getting a job at Lockheed Martin following his 4-year service in the Air Force.
 - Rehmet (segment begins 01:22): “I was in college whenever I got the call to serve the country in the Air Force. And after serving four years, enlisted in the Air Force. I got out and got a job working in aviation, because that's what I did. I worked on B 52 bombers when I was in the Air Force, and so I missed it a lot, and I found a job here in Fort Worth Lockheed Martin, working on the F 35 Fighter program. And it's an extreme passion of mine aviation. And I got to really learn quickly about, you know, my contract and the union that I had joined. And it the International Association of machinists and Aerospace Workers, the IAM for short, and I immediately wanted, I felt gratitude, because I was like, I have extremely, you know, good benefits. It built me a stable life. And so again, I just, I started getting active in my union. I quickly became the president of my local Lodge. Got elected. That's a that's about 1500 members, give or take. And after I had gotten elected and served as the president of my local about three or four years after that, I had seen that there's a state level position that I wanted to run for, for the Union, which was the president of the Texas State Council of machinists and I won that election two years ago, and I've been serving in that role. And in that role, I represent over 30,000 machinists in this great state, and I inter interfere with, like, bad legislation that will hurt, you know, my machinist workers, stuff like that. So I'll work directly with politicians on, you know, both sides of the aisle, you know, if, if I have to to, you know, get things done. So that's a bit about my background, and, you know, I was looking at, you know, trying to serve in a bigger capacity. And you know, I'm really, I'm really frustrated about with what's going on in Texas, you know, for a while, and especially here recently. And so it just makes me that much more enthralled, and, you know, energized for this election because we have to make the Texas Legislature work for working Texans. That's It's really that simple.”
- ◆ Host: “so you're running in a special election this year. What makes this race different, and why should voters of district nine consider you?”
 - Rehmet (segment begins 04:24): “this special election is triggered by a vacancy due to Kelly Hancock taking a comptroller spot appointment from Greg Abbott, Governor Greg Abbott, and so it triggered a special election. And the date was set for November 4 this this year. So this is a special election. You know, there's no incumbent in the. Seat is flippable. So you asked, you know, why should voters choose me? Or why should the voters in senate district nine choose me? Because I think I'm the only one that will actually show up and listen. And I think that that's, you know, one of the problems that I'm seeing a lot people are talking about constituents and not talking to them and listening, yeah. So yeah, not just that, you know, I want to start making, you know, strides in our working conditions here in Texas and and, you know, we're union, we're low density and union here in the

state. And I want to try and, you know, legislate ways to increase that make it easier to unionize here in Texas, because I have personally benefited from, you know, a union. I want others to as well. It's important to me.”

- ◆ Rehmet (segment begins 14:14): “I would love part of the work that I do in legislature be going against, you know, creating, you know, laws to help protect people who are vulnerable because they're trying to, you know, get the right to bargain.”

Rehmet really does not understand how a private sector business operates. He says that if *he* owned a business, he would be “proactive” and make contact with a union and “say, hey, you know, I want my guys represented” but admits they won’t do that because “it’s not in their best interest.”

- ◆ Rehmet (segment begins 18:10): “Um, so again, it's it's interesting, because I actually don't think a lot of small businesses are organized when you compare them to the big, big corporations, because typically on a smaller scale. Look, I would love to see everyone organized in a union, but some businesses aren't geared that way, and they can still

provide really good benefits to their employees. I'm not sitting I'm not, you know, I'm a union man, I'm a union leader. I do think unions are good however, you know, there's some shops. Yes, we have, like, two people, 10 people, yeah, but there's also shops we walk, if we walk in there, and they're getting, they're getting treated so well, and they know it. We couldn't organize them anyway. And it's normally these smaller, small businesses, you know. But they hire, you know, their family or people they know, you know, so, but let me, let me answer your question, because that is actually really good question. Um, you know, if, if I was, you know, a mid size business owner, or, sorry, business owner of a mid sized company, you know, I would just go, go to pick a union, and I would go talk to them first, be, be, you know, your workers to the punch and just say, hey, talk to the union. Say, Hey, you know, I want my guys represented, but they'll never do that because it's not in their best interest. It's not going to hit their like, why would they do that? It's, it's not, it's just one of those things that it's kind of gotta be, gotta be fought out, I think.”

Rehmet is endorsed by his union, an AFL-CIO affiliate. Rehmet reported a \$5,000 contribution from Machinist Non-Partisan Political League. The “nonpartisan” political arm of the International Association of Machinists and Aerospace Workers contributes 97% to democrats at the federal level. In Texas, the Machinists gave \$25,000 to Fair Shot Texas, a PAC that got nearly a quarter million from the Soros-backed Texas Majority PAC.



And, you know, I know a really big thing also is the tolls in Senate District nine are crazy. The tolls, they're predatory. Okay? It's, it's insane. So these are a lot of the issues. I mean, I don't care what side of aisle you're on, we all know that these things suck and they need to change.”

Texans deserve to get to work and get home without wasting hours stuck in traffic or going broke at the toll booth. 





FORT WORTH

Cut off for decades, this historic Fort Worth neighborhood is getting new attention

Greenway Place was the kind of place where the whole village raised the children. If you got in trouble, your parents knew about it before you got home, and the friends you made playing in the nearby city dump lasted a lifetime.

It was also one of the first neighborhoods in Fort Worth where Black residents could buy homes. Established in the early 1940's, Greenway became a center of the city's Black culture with [an annual Juneteenth celebration in nearby in Greenway Park](#).

But since the construction of Interstate 35W in 1959, Greenway has been cut off from the rest of the city, sandwiched between the freeway and the Union Pacific rail yard. The neighborhood also faced decline when several residents lost their homes to tax foreclosure.

As Fort Worth grows, and available land in the urban core becomes more scarce, Greenway is getting new attention from home builders. Its location is now its biggest asset, given the proximity to both downtown and the future Panther Island.

Some residents worry the new development will price them out, citing rising property values and the increased property taxes that follow. But the newcomers say they want to improve their neighborhood and help it get the attention it rightfully deserves.


Unlike the single story bungalow style housing built in the 1940s and '50s, the new homes are sleek and boxy with accent lighting and flat outdoor finishes akin to some of the newer built homes in neighborhoods like Linwood or those surrounding TCU.

"If I had the money, I would have done this myself," said neighborhood association president Reed. The neighborhood has tried to clean up some of the empty lots that are overgrown with weeds and filled with trash and wildlife.

The new houses are raising the neighborhood's tax base, but Reed said he'd rather see a new house than an empty lot.

The first buyers of Valenzuela's new homes were mostly employees from Lockheed Martin.

Two of those buyers, William Sharpe and Taylor Rehmet, said they've tried to become active members of the community rather than just people trying to cash in on a developing neighborhood.

Rehmet, who moved to Greenway in January 2021 after living in a D.R. Horton Community in east Fort Worth, said the neighborhood reminded him of where he grew up in Garland.

“It’s that mentality where we all kind of look out for each other in this small community,” he said.

Both acknowledged there was some hesitation from neighbors when they first moved in. Sharpe recounted a conversation with Reed in which the neighborhood leader commented the pair would stay in Greenway just long enough until they could find a house in a gated community.

“I could see where he was coming from, but told him that was absolutely not what’s happening,” Sharpe said.

Both jumped at the chance to build a new sign for Delga Park on the north side of the neighborhood. They collaborated with Reed, who worked with the city to get proper permits for the sign

Rehmet referenced the saying about society grows great when old men plant trees whose shade they’ll never sit in. He said Reed is like that for Greenway, and both he and Sharpe want to be able to follow in those footsteps.

THE G-WORD

Valenzuela didn't shy away from the idea that his homes may be gentrifying Greenway.

Land values have shot up since since he started building in the neighborhood. Of the four empty lots Valenzuela still owns, their appraised value rose from \$5,000 in 2021 to around \$36,000 in 2022.

"It's always in the back of my mind," he said, adding it's not his goal to make people uncomfortable or push people out.

At the same time, Valenzuela argued his developments have been a net positive to the neighborhood,.

"People are cleaning up their yards, doing detail work on their houses, and there's more pride in the community," he said.

Still older residents on fixed income are feeling the pressure of rising prices, said longtime resident Peoples. She lives in a house owned by her deceased brother, which prevents her from getting a homestead exemption that would protect her from rapidly rising home values.

"Maybe I'm blind to it because the situation I have with the homestead and over 65 tax exemptions, but I'd rather see homes than vacant lots full of trash and weeds," he said.

His biggest concern is an influx of apartments. He referenced the nearby Rock Island neighborhood along Samuels Avenue where several single family homes were bought up before being turned into apartment complexes.

Several of those displaced families moved to Greenway, Reed said, adding he doesn't want to see the same thing happen in his neighborhood.

Both Rehmet and Sharpe acknowledged the perception that new property owners are gentrifying Greenway, but he countered by saying they are doing it with the intention of making the neighborhood better for everyone.

"I'm proud of where we live, and that's not gonna change," Rehmet said.


