In January 2025, Jimenez’s wife posted a “Big Life Update” on LinkedIn that she was leaving her job in Connecticut and “embarking on an exciting new journey as CEO of Rock Bottom Ranch TX, LLC”. On January 24, 2025, Katy Jimenez responded to a comment on her own post, saying she “cannot wait to be back” and “get out of this cold.” \_\_\_\_\_ 20

The website for Rock Bottom Ranch states: “It’s official—we’re coming home! After years of dreaming, planning, and growing, Rock Bottom Ranch is finally taking root in the heart of Texas. This isn’t just a move; it’s the realization of a dream that has transformed our lives. We’re thrilled to begin this journey back in Elgin, a community that feels like the perfect blend of our city and country roots... This March, our family will officially return to Texas, ready to reconnect with old friends, family, and this incredible community.” \_\_\_\_\_ 25

A March 2025 blog post on Rock Bottom Ranch by Katy Jimenez states: “After years spent away, returning to Central Texas and establishing Rock Bottom Ranch has truly been a dream come true for me and my family.” \_\_\_\_\_ 27

Chris Jimenez was active on Indeed.com in September 2023 and showed his location as Prospect, Connecticut while looking for a job. \_\_\_\_\_ 29

*Jimenez wants more smoke and vape shops in your neighborhood.* Jimenez say he will fight to get rid of the Texas “hemp ban.” Jimenez is complaining that the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) is regulating THC products to close gaps allowing people to buy “smokable hemp cannabis.” Regulations also clarified age restrictions, raised licensing fees, and add new labeling, testing and bookkeeping requirements. At the same time, Jimenez claims he supports “smart regulation, clear standards and enforcement that targets bad actors”—*well that’s what the DSHS rules do.* \_\_\_\_\_ 31

*A Democrat election denier?* Jimenez does not think that the 2026 primary elections were “free and Fair” because on the day of the primary people had to wait in line and an election worker

didn't say to Jimenez "good morning thank you for being here, thanks for taking part in democracy." \_\_\_\_\_ 33

*Weak on immigration and border control.* Jimenez wants ICE gone, attending an "ICE out" rally in Austin and accusing the federal law enforcement officers of causing "terror." \_\_\_\_\_ 34

*Don't California my Texas.* Jimenez hired a radical leftist from California to be his campaign manager. Chelsea Fonteno posted she "just moved to Austin to run a target state house race (Chris Jimenez in HD 52)" and will spend "the next 7 months working hard to flip this red seat blue." \_\_\_\_\_ 35

On his personal Facebook page, Jimenez "likes" Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez. AOC is the only non-Texan politician he "likes" on Facebook. \_\_\_\_\_ 41

Jimenez supported local Democrats in Cedar Park Texas by block walking for Jim Penniman-Morin, Darron Jurajda, and Shweta Pandmanabha. Each of these candidates ended up winning their races, but Jimenez's public support of them may prove to be a vulnerability for him in other parts of HD 52. \_\_\_\_\_ 42

Jimenez, in a cringy video set to the Marine Corps hymn, picks up and throws out a strategically placed piece of trash and tells the camera awkwardly "service doesn't stop when you come, it's about lifting up the people around you and serving your community" except for some reason his voice is all choked up and he drops the last syllable in "community." \_\_\_\_\_ 44

Jimenez is claiming to be endorsed by VoteVets, the far-left dark money group linked to Pete Buttigieg. As of May 18, 2026, VoteVets does not list Jimenez as an endorsed candidate on their website, although they list other Texas State Rep candidates. Jimenez mentions the group on his campaign website and made a video celebrating his endorsement. \_\_\_\_\_ 45

Jimenez brags about his endorsement from the racial identitarian, far left group, Black Austin Democrats (BAD). BAD believes they should be the voice for black Texans and "organize" blacks into voting for their candidates, stating "Everyone in the Black community must organize, and then we decide whether we will have alliance with other people or not." BAD was noted for their advocacy to Defund the Police, during the height of the BLM hysteria, helping push through police budget cuts in Austin. BAD has stated that they are "very intentional" when endorsing candidates, stating they privately screen them to make sure they believe Black Lives Matter. \_\_\_\_\_ 59

Jimenez wants more money for the public school system and will oppose efforts to empower parents with more control over their children's education. Jimenez will push the secular leftwing agenda under the guise of "defending religious freedom." \_\_\_\_\_ 68

Jimenez is an enthusiastic supporter of James Talarico. \_\_\_\_\_ 69

*Who does Jimenez look up to for political inspiration? Why Arizona Senator Ruben Gallego, of course.* Jimenez thanked Gallego and posted a photo of the two of them together in March

2026. Gallego's star sharply fell when his good friend Eric Swalwell was pressured to drop out of the California gubernatorial race following multiple sexual assault allegations against him. Due to their close relationship, Gallego had to distance himself from Swalwell, and faced scrutiny for initially dismissing the allegations. Around the same time, Gallego was accused of sexual misconduct and campaign finance violations by Rep. Anna Paulina Luna. \_\_\_\_\_ 71

Jimenez brags about his endorsement from the radical group, East WilCo Democrats. Jimenez claims that his campaign isn't about "right and left" but he touts the endorsement of an unapologetically "progressive" group. \_\_\_\_\_ 75

Jimenez teamed up with Rep. Gene Wu: the two campaigned together at the poorly-attended "Vote Them Out Rally." Wu advocates for racialized politics where minorities like Asians, Latinos and African-Americans team up together, "realize they have the same oppressor," and "take over this country" from the evil "white" people. \_\_\_\_\_ 78

Jimenez: "This is a top and bottom problem. This is a problem with the haves and the have nots. I believe they took too much. There's systems in place that they use to siphon us out. They siphon our money. They siphon our energy. And we become too complicit with what they do." \_\_\_\_\_ 82

Jimenez nods along in agreement with Gene Wu as Wu attempts to turn the Texas state races into a referendum on Trump's governance of the federal government. Wu won't even welcome disaffected Trump voters: "let me tell you, buddy, you don't get to walk away that easy...you voted for it... and you know what, in my culture, when you fuck up this bad, you come and fix it, you have to come and help fix the mess that you created, and you're going to come out and you're going to donate... I don't care that you're not a Democrat. I don't care that you hate Democrats. You're going to help the only people who are fighting for this country and fighting to put everything back the way it was." \_\_\_\_\_ 84

Jimenez (as registered agent) and his wife (manager) formed KJ Consulting LLC in July 2025. However, they failed to pay the registration fee, and the Secretary of State then revoked the entity's certification of formation and dissolved the company. \_\_\_\_\_ 88

Jimenez's wife, Katy Jimenez, is a precinct chair for the Williamson County Democratic Party. \_\_\_\_\_ 91

It's not about "right and left," but even liberal Republican women are traitors in Jimenez's eyes, who stated "Susan Collins betrayed American women..." in a now deleted tweet. \_\_\_\_\_ 92

In January 2026, after the death of Alex Pretti in Minneapolis, Jimenez recorded a video while on the verge of (fake) tears. For Jimenez, what happened to Pretti "is more than just an egregious attack on the Constitution," he then talks about coming together and how we "deserve better." Yet he stated Pretti "was gunned down by a group of thugs;" that's not honest. Pretti was obstructing federal law enforcement (what Democrats used to call an "insurrection") and Pretti was armed with a gun. He was a professional agitator who was active

in the signal groups to swarm law enforcement when doing their job. He was on video attacking ICE agents and damaging their vehicle. The real tragedy was that local law enforcement weren't cooperating with ICE to maintain order, and Pretti was allowed (and encouraged) to act like a maniac. \_\_\_\_\_ 94

Jimenez is running on affordability and wants to fight for “fair property tax policy.” *Does he support all the work Republicans have done to keep gas prices below the national average with pro-energy policies, provide historic property tax reductions and bring in businesses to diversify government revenue streams.* \_\_\_\_\_ 98

In federal campaign contributions, Jimenez claimed to be owner and VP of Sales of Today’s Business Solutions LLC, an office supply/procurement company. Records from the Secretary of State reveal that after his father, Roberto “Robert” Jimenez died, the company was divided to give Chris Jimenez a 10% and his mother Hermelinda Jimenez a 39% stake in the company, with the remaining 51% going to Chris Jimenez’s sister, Priscilla Luna, who runs the company. Ever since 2020, Chris Jimenez has not appeared on the paperwork, despite no other amendments being filed. The company is not mentioned on his Personal Financial Statement, covering calendar year 2025. Strangely, Robert Jimenez still digitally signs the paperwork. 100

*“Connecticut Chris” Jimenez is a “rancher” who owns 1.5 acres. His “Rock Bottom Ranch” is both his home and an event space business he and his wife operate. The surrounding 80+ acres are owned by Gene and Eileen Niswander who sold him the parcel and financed it for them.* \_\_\_\_\_ 106

*Connecticut Chris struggles to lasso something on his “ranch” with a picturesque pecan orchard in the background...the Deed for his property shows the pecan trees still belong to the Niswanders.* \_\_\_\_\_ 120

Formed in April 2025, Rock Bottom Ranch was involuntarily terminated in November 2025 by the Texas Secretary of State for not paying the filing fee. Jimenez successfully applied for it to be reinstated in December 2025. \_\_\_\_\_ 122

In 2024, the Texas Secretary of State officially forfeited the status of Jimenez’s Yellow Footprints Coffee Co, LLC for failure to file required franchise tax reports. The LLC remains forfeited. \_\_\_\_\_ 126

Jimenez donated to Beto O’Rourke and Colin Allred. \_\_\_\_\_ 128

Jimenez reported a \$750 contribution from Texas Majority PAC. In August 2025, AG Paxton announced the George Soros-funded PAC was under investigation “for its role in potentially unlawful financial coordination and bribery of Democratic legislators who fled Texas to break quorum.” \_\_\_\_\_ 129

Five years ago, Jimenez was cheering on Tesla moving to Texas. He liked a photo of Abbott and Musk doing the long horn hand sign. \_\_\_\_\_ 131

Jimenez is a plaintiff in the largest mass tort multidistrict litigation in U.S. history. Over 240k soldiers and veterans filed suit against 3M for defective ear plugs. \_\_\_\_\_ 132

New state rules that eliminate natural smokeable hemp products and increase licensing fees went into effect Tuesday. Hemp industry leaders say these new regulations will eliminate a majority of their inventory and force those who don’t have extra income to meet these new fees to close stores.

Earlier in March, the Texas Department of State Health Services released regulations on consumable hemp-derived THC products that went into effect on March 31. These new regulations include child-resistant packaging, a significant increase in licensing fees, new labeling, testing, and bookkeeping requirements. The rules also codify the legal purchasing age to 21, which went into effect last year as an emergency directive.

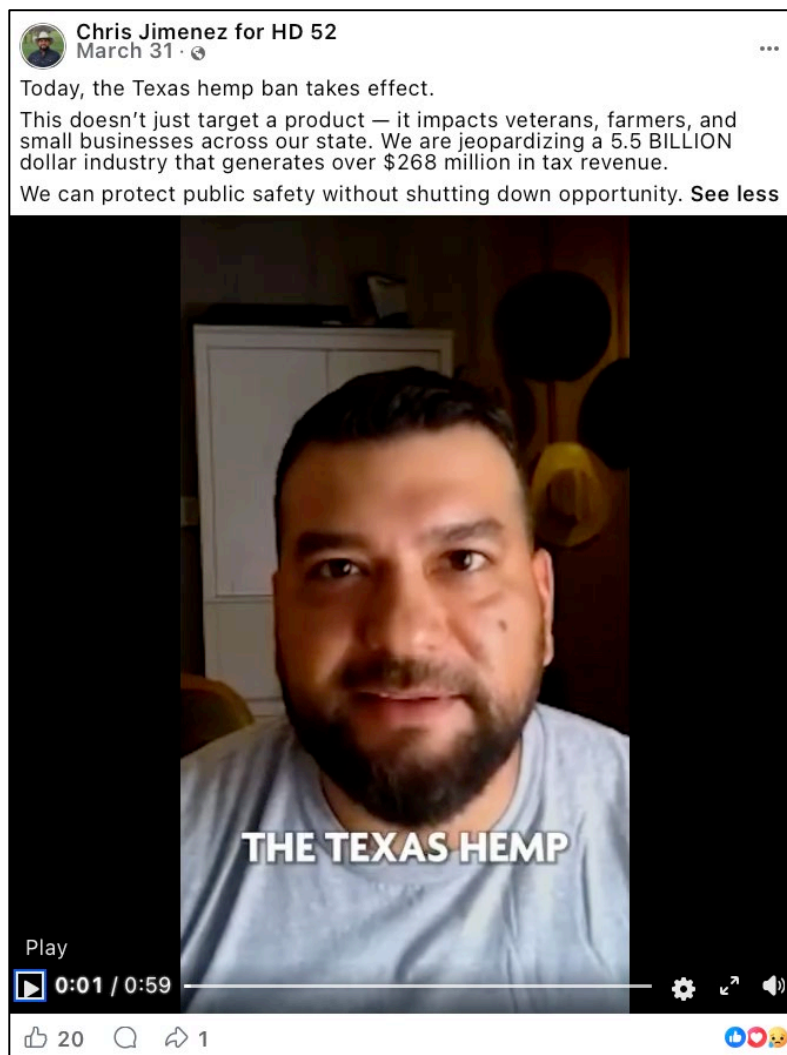
However, hemp retailers say the regulation that decreases the amount of total THC in products they sell to 0.3% will eliminate popular smokeable hemp

products, such as rolled joints and smokeable flower buds, which make up more than 50% of some stores' inventories.

## Disclosures Shed Light on Relationship Between VoteVets and Buttigieg Campaign

As wealthy special interests continue to tilt the political system in their favor by writing six and seven-figure checks to super PACs, Congress has failed to update campaign finance laws to ensure the independence of those super PACs.

And in the absence of congressional action, new evidence of close ties continues to emerge, such as in the case of former presidential candidate Pete Buttigieg and the super PAC that supported his campaign in the Democratic primary.

Super PACs may raise and spend unlimited amounts only if they are independent of the candidates they support. The super PAC VoteVets was anything but independent Federal Election Commission (FEC) reports shed further light on how closely it was linked to the Buttigieg campaign.

While much of this activity may not have violated the letter of current law, it at a minimum violated its spirit.

VoteVets saw its fundraising explode as Buttigieg's campaign took off earlier this year, buoyed in large part by six-figure donations from major Buttigieg donors, and then drop dramatically after Buttigieg's exit from the race. This trajectory is yet further evidence of how VoteVets operated as effectively an extension of the Buttigieg campaign.

VoteVets endorsed Buttigieg in December ("its first presidential endorsement ever," VoteVets emphasized) and went on to spend \$3.6 million supporting his candidacy.

In February 2020, Campaign Legal Center (CLC) filed an FEC complaint alleging that the super PAC illegally coordinated hundreds of thousands of dollars in spending with the Buttigieg campaign, after a campaign staffer tweeted—and the super PAC heeded—a detailed request for pro-Buttigieg ads in Nevada.

The ties between the super PAC and campaign did not end there.

---

Earlier this year, the super PAC hired a former Buttigieg fundraiser named Zachary Allen. Then, in February, top donors to the Buttigieg campaign started writing big checks to VoteVets.

According to CLC's analysis, all ten individual donors who gave direct six-figure sums to VoteVets in February had previously given at least \$2,800 to the Buttigieg campaign. Two of those donors had also given six-figure checks at the end of the previous month; up until that point, VoteVets had largely been raising more moderate amounts.

This strongly suggests that these wealthy donors gave to the "independent" VoteVets in order to support Buttigieg—potentially in response to solicitations by Buttigieg's former fundraiser.

Allen's jump from the Buttigieg campaign to the super PAC does raise legal questions. A campaign staffer is generally supposed to undergo a 120-day "cooling off" period before going to work for an outside group supporting that campaign.

Allen didn't wait that long: the Buttigieg campaign's final reported payment to Allen's consulting firm, V2 Consulting was December 27. VoteVets' first reported payment to Allen's firm was less than two months later, on February 24 (and reports indicate he started working for the super PAC even earlier).

Buttigieg dropped out of the race on March 1. And VoteVets then disclosed a dramatic drop in its fundraising: the group raised more than \$10 million in February, but raised only about \$300,000 in March—just 3% of its February total. In April, it raised even less: just \$100,000 in new contributions.

In sum: VoteVets hired a Buttigieg campaign fundraiser, and, shortly after that, top donors to the Buttigieg campaign started writing big checks to VoteVets. Once Buttigieg dropped out of the presidential race, those checks stopped flowing, and VoteVets raised only 3% of what it had the previous month.

Notably, the close fundraising ties between the Buttigieg campaign and VoteVets may not have violated the law. Current coordination rules largely focus on coordinated campaign spending, rather than coordinated fundraising.

Even if most of these activities do not violate current law, they directly contravene assumptions courts have drawn on when allowing unlimited "independent" spending in our elections. If spending is completely independent of candidates, courts' logic has gone, it cannot be limited on anti-corruption grounds.

Yet complete independence would seem to be a far cry from how VoteVets and the Buttigieg campaign—merely one of many examples of pairs of campaigns and supposedly independent outside groups—were functioning.

---

Bipartisan legislation like H.R. 679, the Political Accountability and Transparency Act, as well as provisions in H.R. 1, the For the People Act, would update federal law to address this problematic practice.

Both bills would deem Vote Vets' spending coordinated if it ran pro-Buttigieg ads after hiring the Buttigieg campaign's recent fundraiser, regardless of whether that person informed the super PAC's ads.

## Our History

Black Austin Democrats traces its roots back to the early 1980s, likely around 1981 or 1982, mirroring the emergence of similar groups across Texas. This momentum was ignited by the establishment of the Coalition of Black Democrats in 1980. The statewide organization's genesis is detailed on its website:

The concept that evolved into the Coalition of Black Democrats began in January 1979 at the home of Mrs. Sallye Moore of Grand Prairie, Texas. A small group from Arlington, Dallas, Fort Worth, and Grand Prairie met to discuss the possibility of establishing a network between African Americans in the Metroplex. The group met for about six months and later decided to call a meeting of African American grassroots leaders from across the state to share the idea.

The meeting was held at the Holiday Inn in Duncanville, Texas on August 25, 1979. Robert Malson, Assistant Director of Domestic Policy for the White House was the speaker. Those in attendance enthusiastically embraced the idea and decided to call a statewide meeting to be held in Austin, Texas. Several planning meetings were held including Austin in October 1979 and Corsicana in January 1980.

The first state conference was held in Austin on February 22-24, 1980. Three hundred fifty-six registered delegates participated in the Austin meeting.

Workshops were conducted by Conrad Mallet, Jr., Black Affairs, DNC; Dr. James R. Ukockis, Sr., Economist, Department of Treasury; Edgar Berlin, Department of Labor; David Rivers, Department of Energy; Eddie B. Johnson, Health Service Administration. The Luncheon Speaker was Congressman Ron Dellums (D-California) and the banquet speaker was Ambassador Andrew Young.

Among the Austinites instrumental in the organization's founding were Richard Scott, Ben Dukes, Sr., Wilhemina Delco, and numerous others. Notably, a significant portion of the organization's early membership comprised government employees, elected officials, and individuals affiliated with core Democratic Party constituencies, including labor.

## Austin City Council cuts police department budget by one-third, mainly through reorganizing some duties out from law enforcement oversight

Gov. Greg Abbott said Austin officials' vote "puts the brave men and women of the Austin Police Department and their families at greater risk" — and vowed that the Texas Department of Public Safety will "stand in the gap."

The Austin City Council unanimously voted to cut its police department budget by \$150 million on Thursday, after officers and the city's top cop faced months of criticism over the killing of an unarmed Black and Hispanic man, the use of force against anti-police brutality protesters and the investigation of a demonstrator's fatal shooting by another citizen.

Those criticisms coincided with protests across Texas and the country calling for reforms on police tactics and the "defunding" of law enforcement in favor of redistributing funds to social services and alternative public safety programs. The council's move makes Austin the first of Texas' four biggest cities to drastically cut police department funding. The share of the police department budget that was cut is among the largest percentage decreases in the nation this year.

Council member Greg Casar, who crafted the three-tiered plan to reduce the police department budget, said when the Austin community organizes and asks for change, he wants to make sure the council can respond effectively.

"This moment has been born out of a lot of hurt in the community," Casar said at the Thursday morning meeting. "We know we have a long way to go."

The proposal to cut police funding by about one-third of its total \$434 million budget calls for immediately cutting around \$21.5 million from the department, according to a document put together by council members. But city spokesperson Andy Tate said Thursday that the number was closer to \$20 million.

These immediate cuts would include eliminating funding from three planned police cadet classes and reallocating funds to areas like violence prevention, food

access and abortion access programs. However, the council said it may allow one or two cadet classes to begin in fiscal year 2021 if a revised curriculum is completed and a “more appropriate recruitment program” is implemented. It will also consider attrition rates, pension impacts and additional funding as factors influencing its decision on cadet classes.

“The possibility of holding a cadet class in FY21 is dependent on numerous factors and will be reassessed throughout the year,” Tate wrote in an email to The Texas Tribune.

Another \$80 million in police budget cuts would come from a yearlong process that will redistribute civilian functions like forensic sciences, support services and victims’ services out from under the police department and into other parts of city government. About \$50 million would come from reallocating dollars to a “Reimagine Safety Fund” that would divert money toward “alternative forms of public safety and community support through the yearlong reimagining process.”

The council’s proposal also includes eliminating 150 vacant officer positions, so that the police department will begin fiscal year 2021 without any unfilled sworn positions.

Gov. [Greg Abbott](#) said Thursday that the council’s actions represent the triumph of political agendas over public safety, and vowed that the Texas Department of Public Safety will “stand in the gap” to protect Austin until the state Legislature can take up the issue next session.

“Austin’s decision puts the brave men and women of the Austin Police Department and their families at greater risk, and paves the way for lawlessness,” he said in a statement. “Public safety is job one, and Austin has abandoned that duty.”

Texas Attorney General [Ken Paxton](#) said the Austin City Council’s decision to reduce the police department budget was a “political haymaker driven by the pressures of cancel culture” as Austin continues to combat violent crime.

“Unfortunately, the targets of this ‘cancelling’ are the brave men and women who selflessly put their lives on the line to keep our families safe,” he said in a statement. “The city council’s action to slash funding disregards the safety of our capital city, its citizens, and the many guests who frequent it.”

The Austin Police Association tweeted its opposition to the council’s plan.

“The council’s budget proposals continue to become more ridiculous and unsafe for Austinites,” [the group tweeted](#). “They are going to ignore the majority who do not want the police defunded.”

In April, Austin police shot and killed Mike Ramos, an unarmed Black and Hispanic man. That incident, along with the death of George Floyd, a Black man killed by Minneapolis police, prompted weeks of anti-police brutality protests in Austin. During these protests, police critically injured two demonstrators, ages 20 and 16, by firing “less-lethal” rounds at their heads.

In early June, four council members said they had lost faith in Austin Police Chief Brian Manley after his handling of those protests. At least one member called on him to resign, however, city officials confirmed later that Manley would not be fired. Criticism of Austin police intensified after the July 25 killing of armed anti-police brutality protester Garrett Foster who was shot by an armed driver who has not been arrested or charged.

The council unanimously voted in early June to limit officers’ use of force, which included restrictions on use of deadly force and a ban on using “less lethal” munitions during protests.

The Austin City Council spent hours Wednesday listening to more than 200 speakers voice their opinions about cutting the police budget during its public comment period.

Sarah Hay, a District 10 resident, called in to express support for council member Greg Casar’s “Reimagine Public Safety” fund.

“Specifically, we support reimagining traffic safety and enforcement within this proposal,” she said. “We can easily divest over \$18 million from traffic enforcement when most of these functions can be administered by unarmed civilians and is not required to be police work.”

But others said the council’s proposed plan to reduce the budget was not enough.

Two members of Undoing White Supremacy Austin, a local group that seeks to promote racial justice, read a testimony from Alicia Torres Don, an Austin resident who said she is concerned that the money from the police budget will not be redistributed quickly enough under the council’s plan.

“APD will still be able to access this money to continue the functions outlined under these categories, until the city manager and council come up with an alternative,” Torres Don’s statement read. “So this represents an intended, not actual or immediate change. What is most troubling from this amendment is the lack of reallocation into R.E.A.L. solutions.”

R.E.A.L. stands for the RISE Fund, Equity Office, Austin Public Health Department, and Low-Income Housing, which includes a proposal for a \$220 million police

department budget cut for which Austin-area activists at the Communities of Color United group have been advocating.

Texas Values, a socially conservative Christian group, said it was disappointed with the council's vote to fund abortion access programs.


"While the Austin City Council has taken drastic measures in order to allegedly save lives during the pandemic, Austin City Council has made sure that even more lives will be taken with their significant increase in abortion funding," Mary Elizabeth Castle, the group's policy adviser, said in a statement.

City councils around the country have been voting to cut police department budgets, including Los Angeles, which voted to cut \$150 million from its proposed \$1.86 billion budget, and New York City, which slashed \$1 billion from its nearly \$6 billion budget. Portland's mayor and school board said they would discontinue the presence of armed officers from local schools and reallocate the \$1 million designated for these officers into the community.

The Austin City Council directed City Manager Spencer Cronk to craft a community engagement plan ahead of a budget amendment process next March. In the coming months, the council will continue its public safety committee meetings to discuss the details of redistributing police department funding.



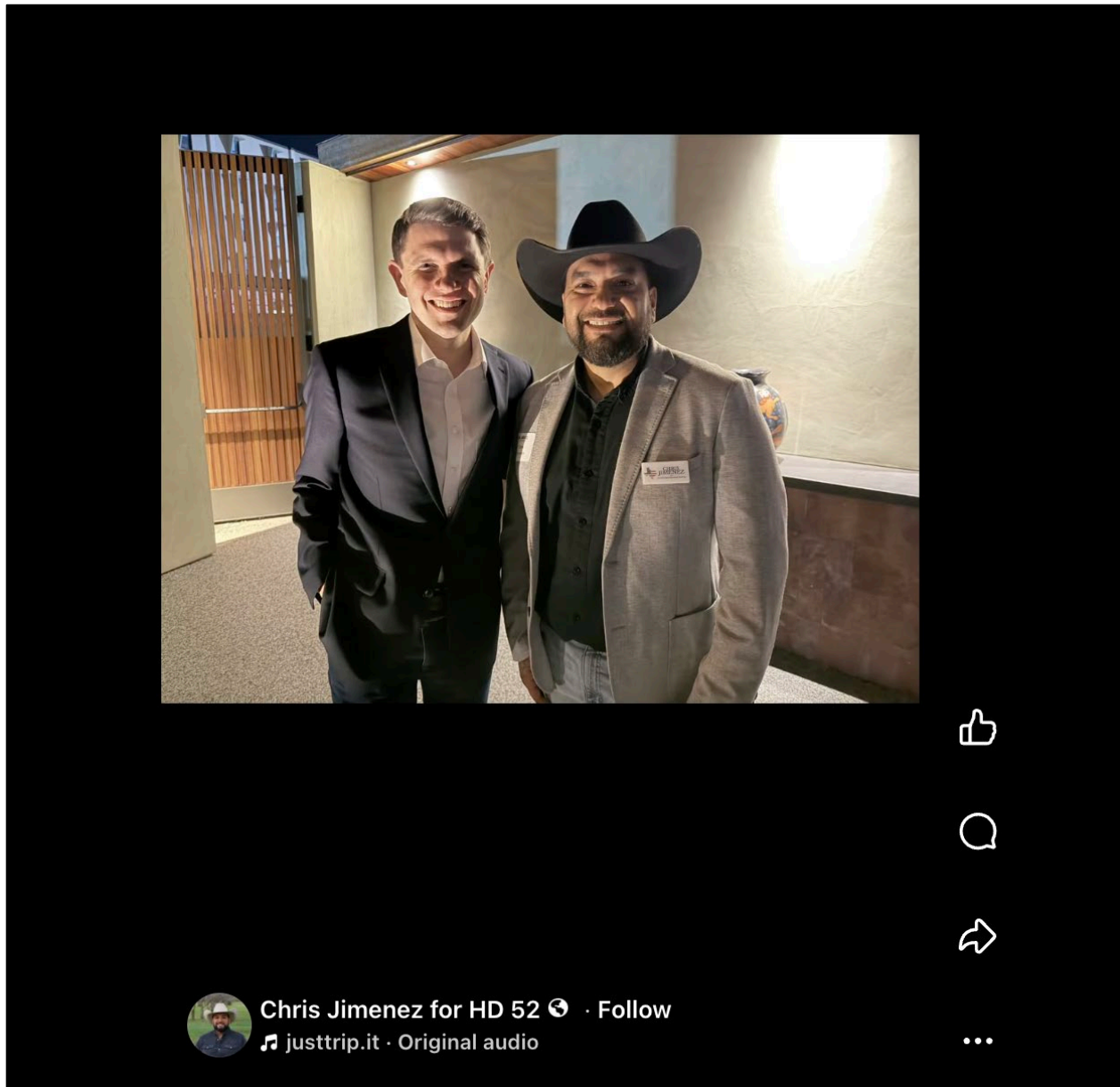

## Sen. Ruben Gallego alleges Eric Swalwell 'lied' and 'betrayed' him, says he never saw inappropriate behavior

The Arizona Democrat said their close friendship "clouded" his judgment about rumors that Swalwell engaged in potentially inappropriate behavior.

"My friendship with him, our family's friendship together with him, clouded my judgment, and I was wrong — I deeply, deeply regret that," Gallego told reporters at a news conference on Capitol Hill.

Gallego said he called the news conference to reject any suggestions that he was aware **of Swalwell's alleged sexual misconduct** toward women. The Democratic senator, who served in the House with Swalwell for a decade, said he had "no knowledge of predatory behavior, sexual assault, or harassment" that have been alleged against the married father of three.

The senator acknowledged that he had heard for "many years" that Swalwell was "just a flirty, social guy," but only recently asked him about the misconduct allegations after they surfaced.

"My family and his family were as close as it gets," Gallego told reporters in explaining why he trusted the House member. "Our kids were in baseball camp together. We had dinner together as a family."

But Gallego said that when rumors about sexual misconduct were circulating several weeks ago — before the **San Francisco Chronicle reported** Friday about a former Swalwell staffer accusing him of two sexual assaults — "I did ask him, and he lied to me," Gallego said.

A former Swalwell aide alleged to the San Francisco Chronicle and CNN last week that she had several sexual encounters with Swalwell while she worked in his congressional office. She accused Swalwell of sexually assaulting her twice when she was too intoxicated to consent.

A source familiar with the woman's account confirmed to NBC News that the reporting by CNN and the Chronicle is accurate. The person spoke on the condition of anonymity due to the sensitivity of the ongoing legal matter.

---

Three other women who spoke to CNN also accused Swalwell of sexual misconduct.

Two of them alleged he sent them unsolicited photos or videos of his penis. One, Ally Sammarco, confirmed her account to NBC News, but the network has not independently corroborated the other women's allegations.

Over the weekend, Swalwell acknowledged making "mistakes" but called the accusations of sexual assault "flat false."

In remarks at a news conference Tuesday, another woman, Lonna Drewes, accused Swalwell of drugging, choking and raping her in a California hotel room in 2018.

An attorney for Swalwell, Sara Azari, later issued a statement saying Swalwell "categorically and unequivocally denies each and every allegation of sexual misconduct and assault that has been leveled against him."

"These accusations are false, fabricated, and deeply offensive — a calculated and transparent political hit job designed to destroy the reputation of a man who has spent twenty years in public service," Azari said.

"We will fight these despicable and baseless accusations with the same tenacity, courage, and conviction that has defined the Congressman's public service," she added.

Gallego was adamant that he never witnessed Swalwell engaging in the reported behavior. "I never saw him engage in any of the predatory behavior, harassment, sexual assault," he repeated.

"He became very good at being a predator, and he clearly preyed on these women in different positions," Gallego alleged.

When reached for comment on Gallego's statements, Swalwell's attorney referred back to statement from earlier Tuesday.

Gallego, who chaired Swalwell's 2020 presidential campaign and has said he's considering his own presidential run in 2028, told reporters that he would be willing to release any information or records to support his comments if there are legal proceedings or subpoenas.

The senator said that after the Chronicle published its story Friday, he called Swalwell and told him to drop out of the California gubernatorial race. Swalwell eventually suspended his campaign Sunday night.

On Monday, just hours after the House Ethics Committee announced it had opened an investigation into him, Swalwell announced he would resign from Congress.

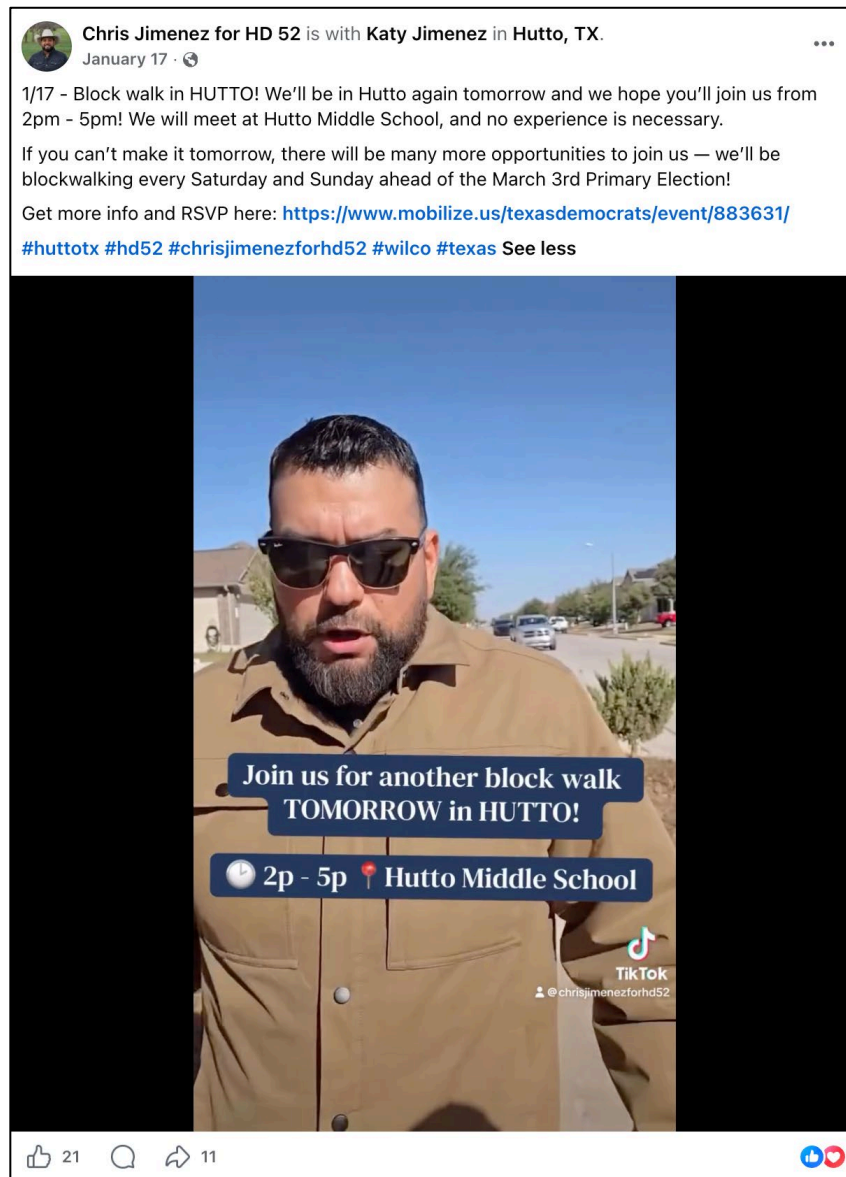

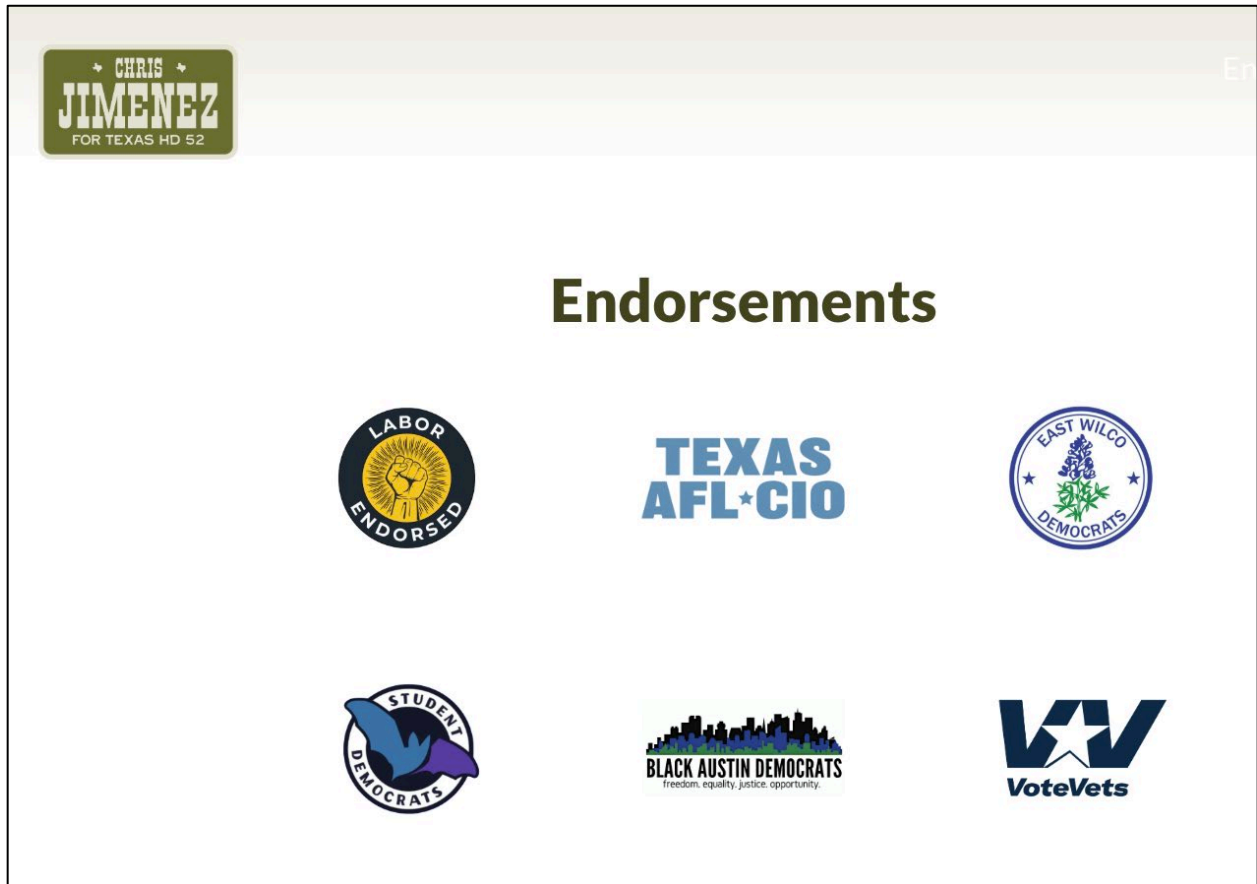

## Texas Democrat blasted for telling Latino, Black, Asian people to unite against 'oppressor,' 'take over' US

State representative Gene Wu said he meant 'Republicans' were oppressor of minorities after 2024 podcast clip resurfaced

The leader of Democrats in the [Texas](#) House of Representatives, state Rep. [Gene Wu](#), is facing conservative backlash after a clip resurfaced of him calling on various racial groups to unite against their common "oppressor."

Vargas argued that the future of the United States will be decided by Texas, asking Wu to give him the big picture. Wu said that one of the powerful forces driving modern politics, particularly regarding immigration, is that "White people" in America are concerned about becoming a racial and political minority.

"The scary thing for me is that what is driving this newest round of anti-immigrant sentiment is purely a sense of White nationalism," Wu said.

"That there is a sense of, 'America really just belongs to White people,' that this was that a lot of people believe that God gave America to White people to rule, and that any time that immigrants, minorities make progress in this country, that that is seen as a slight against them," he continued.

Both agreed that White people are already or almost a racial minority in Texas, with Wu clarifying that for now, they are still the majority of people who are able to vote. The host later asked Wu to talk about his majority-Latino district and the relationship between the Latino and Asian communities, particularly between those of both groups who are immigrants.

"I think you've hit exactly the right point," Wu said. "It's not just Latinos. It's not just Asians. It's not just African Americans. It's everybody. Right? We, our country

and the forces that be, the powers that be, have spent tremendous time, effort and money to make sure that those groups are never united, that they always see each other as enemies, as competitors, without ever realizing that they share one thing in common, that their oppressors all are the same. The oppression comes from one place.

"I always tell people the day the Latino, African-American, Asian and other communities realize that they are — that they share the same oppressor is the day we start winning, because we are the majority in this country now," he continued. "We have the ability to take over this country and to do what is needed for everyone and to make things fair."

The 2024 comments resurfaced on social media, causing Wu to face backlash from fellow Texans.

"Gene Wu is a radical racist who hates millions of Texans just because they're [W]hite. This is who the modern Democrat Party is," Texas Attorney General and Republican Senate candidate [Ken Paxton wrote](#).

Former Texas GOP Chairman [Matt Rinaldi wrote](#), "This clip is being widely circulated for its advocacy for [W]hite genocide. People need to realize that this isn't some random Democrat backbencher. This is the Texas House Democrat caucus LEADER."

"The Democrat party is built on bigotry," [Sen. Ted Cruz, R-Texas, replied](#).

[Rep. Chip Roy](#), also of Texas, called on Wu to resign.

"Unlike many Democrats, he admits his racism against [W]hite people and call to 'take over this country.' He should resign or the TX House should strip him of any power," he wrote. "Another reason to [pass my PAUSE Act](#). Stop importing people who hate you."

After the backlash, Wu appeared to try to backtrack and claim that he was not referring to White people, but Republicans.

The [Houston Chronicle's Evan Mintz](#), reporting on the viral clip from the longer interview, noted that "nowhere in the clip does Wu talk about [W]hite people."

However, Wu had referred to "White people" and their racial anxiety of becoming a minority in America before the segment shown in the clip.

"Just to clarify, I even called up Wu to ask who, exactly, he meant by 'shared oppressor,'" Mintz wrote. "His answer: Republicans."

"It is undeniable that Republicans have spent the past 50 years beating down communities," Wu told the writer.

"To their credit, some Republicans engaged with what Wu actually said, swiping at him for dividing the American people into subgroups in the first place — which, yes, he did do," Mintz reported.

Wu's office didn't immediately respond to a request for comment.

- Fourteenth Amendment: Equal protection under the law. Enforcement must not be arbitrary or discriminatory, and the government must be held to the same standards in every neighborhood and for every family.

## Attorney General Ken Paxton Launches Investigation into Soros-Funded PAC for Unlawfully Funding Runaway Democrat Legislators

“If Texas lawmakers are bowing to the Soros Slush Fund rather than the will of the voters, Texans deserve to know. Getting financial payouts under the table to abandon your legislative duties is bribery,” said Attorney General Paxton. “Texas Majority PAC’s actions seem to indicate that it may be using its Soros-funded resources to break the law and fund the illegal abandonment of public office. If that’s the case as determined by this investigation, there will be a heavy price to pay.”

As part of the investigation, Attorney General Paxton has issued a Request to Examine to Texas Majority PAC.

This follows Attorney General Paxton’s previous [investigation](#) into Beto O’Rourke’s radical organization, Powered by People, which also seeks documents and communications related to potentially unlawful activity, including the group’s involvement in the Democrats’ scheme to break quorum.



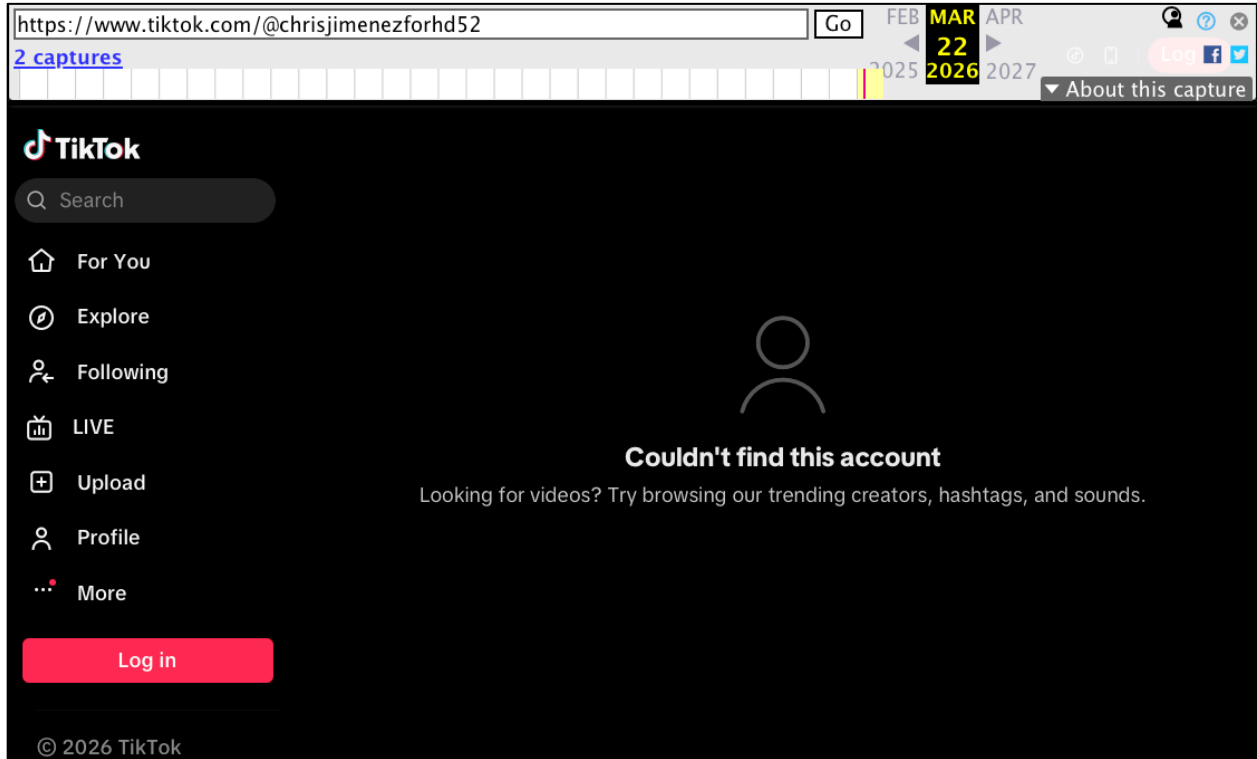

### Affordable Housing & Property Taxes
