

A Once-in-a-Generation Opportunity for National School Choice

The federal Education Freedom Tax Credit (EFTC) puts a K-12 scholarship within reach of 9 in 10 American students, funded by donors who receive a dollar-for-dollar reduction of their federal tax liability up to \$1,700.

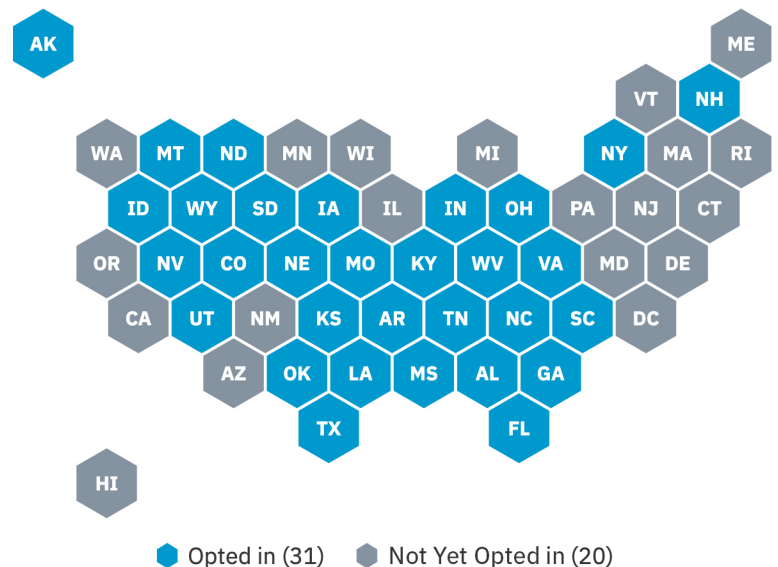
DONOR CLAIMS THE CREDIT

At filing, the donor claims the dollar-for-dollar federal credit.

WHAT THE NUMBERS SHOW

- **Eligibility is near-universal in every state.** The eligible share ranges from 85.9% (District of Columbia) to 96.2% (Maine).
- **31 states have opted in**, home to 30.9 million eligible students (59.8% of the national total).
- **20.8 million eligible students are waiting** in the 19 states and DC that have not yet decided.
- **For 20.5 million students, the EFTC could bring private school choice to their state for the first time.** 18 states currently have no state-level ESA, voucher, or tax credit scholarship program.
- **Most families qualify.** The income limit is 300% of area median income, which ranges from ~\$234,000 to nearly \$500,000 for a family of four, depending on location.
