Introduction

On July 15, 2026, the Fulcrum Intel research team began an assessment of Denise Wooten’s personal, professional, and political history. This report outlines the results of our research and provides an analysis of the resulting information relating to Wooten and her vulnerabilities as a candidate for Texas House District 63. Executive Summary

Denise Wooten has centered her campaigns on progressive positions that place her well to the left of many Texas voters. She has been an outspoken opponent of school choice, pledging to repeal Texas’s education savings account program and arguing that public funding should never be used for private or religious schools. Wooten has also advocated for expanded LGBTQ+ protections, supported access to gender-transition treatments for minors, promoted DEI initiatives, and participated in multiple “No Kings” protests while using the events to promote her campaign.

Wooten has paired those positions with rhetoric that undercuts her claims of wanting to work across the aisle. She has repeatedly criticized President Trump and his supporters, writing that she had “NO RESPECT” for anyone who voted for Trump and referring to his supporters as a “cult.” She has also backed expanded mail voting and criticized Republican election laws as efforts to suppress voters, while supporting a Texas version of ObamaCare.

Her campaign has also generated questions outside of her policy positions. A former patient alleged in a Google review that Wooten discussed her political campaign during appointments, repeatedly rescheduled visits because of campaign obligations, and left appointments early to

attend campaign meetings. The reviewer also alleged that Wooten's campaign activities overlapped with her psychology practice, an issue further highlighted by a campaign post listing the same address as her private practice as campaign headquarters.

Wooten has yet to demonstrate broad electoral support. Despite running for the Texas House three times, she has never won a contested election, with her only victories coming in uncontested Democratic primaries. Her fundraising has also relied heavily on a small number of large-dollar contributors, with just ten donors accounting for more than half of all itemized contributions raised across her campaigns.

TOP FINDINGS

School Choice

1. Wooten opposes school choice and vouchers.
 - a. She warned vouchers promote elitism and limit opportunity, siding against school choice and for a larger public system.¹
 - b. Wooten opposed school vouchers, arguing Texas had “no business cutting funding” from public schools.²
 - c. She pledged to oppose school vouchers, claiming they reduce opportunity and promote elitism.³
2. Wooten actively campaigned against school vouchers, promoting a postcard campaign urging voters to “Stand with Public Education. Say No to Vouchers.” She thanked Mothers Against Greg Abbott (MAGA) and organizer Antonella Longo for coordinating the effort in House District 63.⁴
3. Wooten identified repealing Texas’s education savings account (ESA) program as a legislative priority, arguing the program should be eliminated immediately. She said repealing the program would redirect up to \$1 billion in funding from private schools back to Texas public schools.⁵

LGBTQ+

1. Wooten pledged to stand with the LGBTQ+ community and deliver on its legislative priorities.
 - a. Wooten said she would support legislation expanding anti-discrimination protections for LGBTQ+ individuals, work with LGBTQ+ advocacy groups to advance their legislative priorities, and stand by transgender students facing what she described as prejudice in schools and harassment from the government.⁶
2. Wooten argued that decisions regarding gender transition procedures should be left to patients, their families, and medical professionals rather than government officials.

- a. She criticized efforts to investigate parents of transgender children or involve Child Protective Services in cases involving gender transition procedures, calling such actions an abuse of government power and arguing they could increase the risk of depression and suicide among children with gender dysphoria.⁷
3. Wooten criticized the Trump administration's restrictions on gender transition procedures for minors, calling the policy "horrible."⁸
 - a. The policies she was criticizing included restricting puberty blockers and gender transition surgeries for children.^{9 10}

Out of State Influence

1. Wooten's second-largest donor is a Chicago Super PAC that spent \$90 million electing Democrats and was caught taking money from elderly dementia patients.
 - a. The Progressive Turnout Project, a Chicago-based Super PAC, gave Wooten \$5,000 in 2022, making it her second-largest donor.^{11 12}
 - b. The organization spent over \$90 million in the 2024 cycle to boost Democratic turnout nationwide and operated an affiliated "STOP TRUMP" PAC.¹³
 - c. The organization was also the subject of a CNN investigation that found affiliated groups collected over \$155,000 from vulnerable elderly donors who may have suffered from dementia.¹⁴

No Kings Participation

1. Wooten attended multiple "No Kings" rallies and encouraged others to participate, describing the demonstrations as "what democracy looks like."^{15 16}

- a. At a March 2026 rally, she posed with a sign reading, “My Royals Are Drag Queens,” in front of one of her campaign signs and used the event to promote her Texas House campaign by sharing a fundraising link with supporters.^{17 18}
- b. No Kings protests are funded by far-left organizations and liberal-mega donor George Soros, and are regularly attended by socialist and communist groups.^{19 20}

Private Practice/Campaign Overlap

1. In a Google review, a patient alleged that Wooten repeatedly rescheduled appointments and cut one visit short to attend campaign-related meetings.²²
 - a. The reviewer also claimed Wooten discussed her political campaign during appointments, pressured the family to medicate their four-year-old child for ADHD while offering few non-medication alternatives, and left them with more than \$800 in unexpected medical bills after they were allegedly told the testing would only require a co-pay.²³
2. In a February 2024 Facebook post, Wooten referred to a campaign meeting at “HQ,” listing the same Long Prairie Road address used by her psychology practice, suggesting her campaign operated from her business office.²⁴

Support From Radical Groups

2. Wooten is endorsed by Planned Parenthood, which advocates for unrestricted abortion access, provides gender transition services to minors, and has advocated to defund the police.
 - a. Wooten is endorsed by Planned Parenthood Texas Votes, which requires endorsed candidates to commit 100% to supporting abortion access. Nationally, Planned Parenthood provides gender transition hormone therapy to patients as young as 16, and investigations have alleged that some affiliates provided cross-sex

hormones to minors with minimal medical supervision and questionable parental consent.^{25 26 27}

- b. Planned Parenthood has actively participated in efforts to defund the police.²⁸
 - c. Wooten has stated that she supports “women’s healthcare and reproductive rights and their right to decide what to do with their own bodies.”²⁹
3. Wooten is endorsed by and contributed to the Texas Progressive Caucus (TXPC), a far-left organization that demanded “no compromise” on school vouchers and accused Israel of running “open-air prisons.”
- a. The TXPC endorsed Wooten for HD-63 after rating her as “sufficiently progressive.” The organization’s stated mission is to build progressive power to “break the GOP Monopoly” in Texas, and it has threatened Democratic lawmakers who even negotiate on school vouchers with primary challenges and blacklisting from party conventions.^{30 31 32}
 - b. The TXPC also issued a statement on the Middle East accusing Israel of maintaining “open-air prisons” and practicing “apartheid,” and called on the Biden Administration to impose a ceasefire.³³
 - c. The TXPC works in coalition with its “sister organization,” the Texas Legislative Progressive Caucus, whose platform calls for legalizing cannabis, repealing right-to-work laws, and expanding Medicaid.³⁴

Support for Radical Candidates

- 1. Wooten contributed to Amy Klobuchar’s presidential campaign, one of the most liberal members of the U.S. Senate.
 - a. FEC records show Wooten contributed to Amy Klobuchar’s 2020 presidential campaign.³⁵

- b. Klobuchar has never received a rating lower than 85 percent from the Americans for Democratic Action and scored 100 percent in three years, making her one of the Senate's most liberal members.³⁶
 - c. She is pro-choice, supports taxpayer funding of Planned Parenthood, and has called herself “a proven progressive.”^{37 38 39}
- 2. Wooten contributed to Colin Allred, who voted to allow biological males to compete in girls’ sports and access women's locker rooms, as well as calling for ICE to be abolished.
 - a. FEC records show Wooten contributed to Colin Allred's 2024 U.S. Senate campaign against Ted Cruz.⁴⁰
 - b. As a U.S. Representative, Allred voted against the Protection of Women and Girls in Sports Act, which would have banned biological males from competing in women's sports.^{41 42 43}
 - c. He also cosponsored the Equality Act, which would ensure that “individuals who identify as another gender cannot be denied access to the locker room of their choice,” and cosponsored a resolution calling for a “Transgender Bill of Rights” that would guarantee biological men the right to “participate in sports on teams and in programs that best align with their gender identity.”^{44 45 46}
 - d. Allred has also called to “abolish ICE,” stating “I think we should get rid of ICE, abolish ICE, whatever you want to call it,” and pledged to “stop ICE, end the mass raids and make sure every ICE agent who breaks the law is prosecuted.”⁴⁷
- 3. Wooten contributed to Ruben Gallego, a self-described progressive who was a member of the House Medicare for All Caucus, campaigned to abolish the Senate filibuster, faces

sexual misconduct allegations, and is closely tied to disgraced Congressman Eric Swalwell.

- a. FEC records show Wooten contributed to Ruben Gallego's 2024 Arizona Senate campaign.⁴⁸
- b. Gallego was a member of the Congressional Progressive Caucus and House Medicare for All Caucus.^{49 50 51}
 - i. Estimates indicate that Medicare for all would cost more than \$32 trillion over ten years.⁵²
- c. He also led the push to abolish the Senate filibuster in order to codify abortion rights into federal law, and Bernie Sanders called him “one of two leaders of the progressive movement.”^{53 54 55}
- d. In July 2026, three sources told the New York Post that Gallego had sexual relationships with two House staffers working for Democratic colleagues, including one woman in her 20s.^{56 57}
- e. Gallego is also a close personal friend of disgraced former Rep. Eric Swalwell, who resigned from Congress in April 2026 after at least four women accused him of sexual misconduct, including a former staffer who alleged sexual assault.^{58 59}

Second Amendment

1. Wooten supports excessive gun control measures and is endorsed by multiple gun control groups.
 - a. Wooten said she supported increasing the minimum age to purchase assault rifles, banning high-capacity magazines, and expanding gun safety measures.⁶⁰

- b. Wooten received the “Gun Sense Voter” distinction from Everytown for Gun Safety, and was named a Moms Demand Action Gun Sense Candidate. Moms Demand Action is also tied to Everytown for Gun Safety.^{61 62}
- c. Everytown recommends the following solutions, among others: background checks on all gun sales, blocking a federal concealed carry mandate, prohibiting open carry, not arming teachers, gun dealer reform, banning assault weapons, and similar policies.⁶³

Health Care

1. Wooten is a proponent of a Texas version of the Affordable Care Act, specifically calling for reinstating funds for Planned Parenthood.⁶⁴
 - a. The ACA increased the cost of health care and health insurance.⁶⁵
 - b. The ACA led to Americans paying more money for less health coverage, with average deductibles increasing over 300% between 2006 and 2017.⁶⁶
 - c. The ACA led to fewer insurance choices for nearly 80% of Americans.⁶⁷

Unserious Candidate

1. Wooten has yet to win a contested election despite running for the Texas House three times.
 - a. Wooten’s only election victories came in uncontested Democratic primaries. She advanced to the general election in both 2022 and 2026 without facing a primary opponent but has never defeated an opponent in a contested race.^{68 69 70 71}
 - b. Wooten lost the 2022 general election to Republican Ben Bumgarner by nearly 12 percentage points after receiving 44.07 percent of the vote. Two years later, she also failed to secure her party’s nomination, losing the 2024 Democratic primary to former State Rep. Michelle Beckley by nearly a two-to-one margin.^{72 73}

2. Prior to the 2022 general election, *The Dallas Morning News* endorsed Wooten, but questioned her experience, political judgment, and readiness for office.
 - a. The endorsement stated, “Wooten, a Democrat, is far from polished, and she knows it. She went as far as to ask us for campaign advice, which we don’t give. She’ll have to learn on the job.”⁷⁴
 - b. While the editorial ultimately backed Wooten, it concluded that Wooten was “further left and less experienced than we would like.”⁷⁵

Phony Bipartisanship

1. While Wooten has claimed to desire bipartisanship should she be elected, her rhetoric on Trump supporters suggests otherwise.
 - a. Wooten wrote that she had “NO RESPECT for anyone who voted for Trump–NONE” while criticizing his economic policies.⁷⁶
 - b. She argued that Trump’s policies would hurt his own supporters the most and said that even if they did not care about “all the vulnerable people he would hurt, they should have cared at least for their own pocketbooks.”⁷⁷
 - c. Wooten referred to Trump supporters as “Trump’s cult.” After Donald Trump’s federal indictment in 2023, she wrote that the evidence against him was “compelling” and said she wished “Trump’s cult would logically examine the facts, but I doubt it.”⁷⁸

Biography

Campaign Biography

“My roots come from middle America within a working-class family, which imparted significant values: a strong work ethic, the sense of community responsibility, a charitable mindset, fiscal conservatism, fierce patriotism, and the inclusive embrace of diversity within our social network. Growing up, my father was a small-town pastor and a parole officer at the federal penitentiary, while my mother balanced roles as a homemaker, pastor's wife, and paid positions as an aide in nursing homes or as a bookkeeper.

Our family resources were thin sometimes, so we relied on a half-acre garden for sustenance during my entire childhood, which was quite labor-intensive for all of us. My father was famous for his red tomatoes, but figured out he could grow yellow ones with less acid content for folks in the nursing home, where we often went on Sunday afternoons to provide residents a church service. In the family, our needs were met, but luxuries and wishes were rarely obtained. I swear we were the last Americans to get a television and a dishwasher, and with a family of 6, that was a ton of dishes to wash by hand. Money for a car, college, room and board, and living expenses was scarce, so I worked from 15 years of age onward to pay for what I needed.

Somehow, I always believed that if I worked hard and utilized opportunities, I could make my future be what I wanted. Indeed, that is what happened. I put myself through undergraduate and graduate school so I could fulfill my dream of becoming a psychologist. My strongest motivation came from my family's core values that placed a premium on centering on others rather than oneself and offering assistance to those in need. Plus, I love words, concepts, and people (who are endlessly fascinating to me), so psychology has suited my skills, values, and interests. Indeed, I would be a psychologist even if I won the lottery and did not need an income!

My core belief in the rightness of public service has carried me through my endeavors as a psychologist and now has led me to run for this office in order to try to help a broader scope of people. I spent the first 8 years of my profession working in non-profit settings, wherein we served people of all income levels, ethnicities, and family structures. After entering private practice closer to home so I could be with my young children more, I continued to embody that “service for all” mentality by keeping my fees lower than average, offering sliding fees and pro bono services as needed, and being on numerous insurance panels (including military, Medicaid, and Medicare) to ensure access to quality care. With reluctance, I had to give up most of the insurance companies over time, as I often lost money and did not have enough income for my

family and staff. Nevertheless, I have continued to maintain less than usual rates, with the flexibility to lower fees if needed.

In running for the office of state representative for HD 63, my mission remains the same as in my clinical practice: serve the needs of as many people as possible, not just the wealthy and powerful, through affecting legislation in Texas. Further, I believe in equipping people--with opportunities for good health care, skill development, and resources to become more independent and functional. For this reason, my favorite local charity is Christian Community Action, as they aspire to “teach people to fish instead of just giving them fish.” There may be some individuals who cannot “learn to fish”, for a variety of reasons, and those we are ethically obligated to fully support. But, for those with the capacity to learn and grow, let's provide them with the health, educational, and employment opportunities to equip them to become more productive citizens. In taking this ethical stance, we benefit not only those individuals, but strengthen the entire community.”⁷⁹

Prior To The 2022 General Election, The Dallas Morning News Endorsed Wooten, But Questioned Her Experience, Political Judgment, And Readiness For Office.

The Dallas Morning News endorsed Denise Wooten over Republican Ben Bumgarner in the 2022 Texas House District 63 race but described both candidates as unprepared for the Legislature. The editorial characterized Wooten as inexperienced, unpolished, and someone who would have to “learn on the job,” noting that she even asked the editorial board for campaign advice. It also suggested she was naïve about her ability to achieve bipartisan compromise in the Legislature, and it expressed concern after Wooten said Democratic Party advisers were encouraging her to be less moderate and urging her to resist pressure from partisan extremes. While the editorial ultimately backed Wooten, it concluded that Wooten was “further left and less experienced than we would like.”¹¹²

ISSUES

Abortion

Wooten Defends Abortion Rights And Has Criticized Efforts To Restrict Access To Abortion.

Wooten argued that overturning Roe v. Wade would eliminate women's right to choose an abortion and impose significant educational, financial, medical, and mental health burdens on women with unplanned pregnancies. She argued that restricting abortion would harm both women and children, contending that many children born from unwanted pregnancies face increased risks of poverty, neglect, abuse, and developmental challenges. Citing her experience as a clinical psychologist, Wooten criticized pro-life advocates and Republicans for supporting abortion restrictions while, in her view, failing to provide sufficient support for mothers and children after birth. She also accused Republicans of using the government to impose religious beliefs, criticized the conservative majority on the U.S. Supreme Court, and argued that abortion restrictions disproportionately harmed vulnerable women.¹³⁴

Climate Change

Wooten Supports Expanding Renewable Energy And Stronger Environmental Protections To Address Climate Change.

Wooten argued that Texas, as the nation's largest emitter of carbon dioxide, needed stronger environmental protections and increased development and use of renewable energy sources. Wooten said she supported policies to address climate change, reduce pollution, and improve grid reliability, arguing that failing to act would contribute to worsening public health problems, extreme heat, and power grid failures.¹³⁵

DEI

Wooten Supports Government Protections For Minority Groups And Promotes Diversity And Inclusion Initiatives.

Wooten said every individual is entitled to respect and protection from discrimination and argued that government has a responsibility to ensure that ethnic minorities, sexual minorities, and people with disabilities feel safe in public, at school, and in the workplace. Wooten also

expressed support for diversity and inclusion, arguing that diversity should be celebrated and, at a minimum, that all people deserve safety and tolerance.¹³⁶

Wooten Said Growing Asian And Hispanic Populations Could Translate Into More Democratic Voters.

In a December 29, 2023 Facebook post, Wooten highlighted an article about population growth in Flower Mound, writing that the area’s Asian and Hispanic communities had increased even as the median age also rose. Wooten said she hoped those demographic changes would “translate into more Democratic voters if we can turn out the vote.”¹³⁷

Education

Wooten Is A Strong Opponent Of School Vouchers.

Wooten said she supported public education for every student and argued that expanding school vouchers in Texas would reduce funding for public schools, particularly for students with learning needs and teacher compensation. She opposed school voucher programs, contending they would reduce educational opportunities for Texas students while perpetuating systemic elitism and bigoted worldviews.¹³⁸

In September 2022, Wooten argued that school voucher programs diverted funding from Texas public schools to private and religious schools. She wrote that vouchers “take away funding from public schools” and asserted that Texas ranked 33rd in the nation for public education, adding that the state had “no business cutting funding.” Wooten pledged not to support school vouchers if elected to represent House District 63.¹³⁹

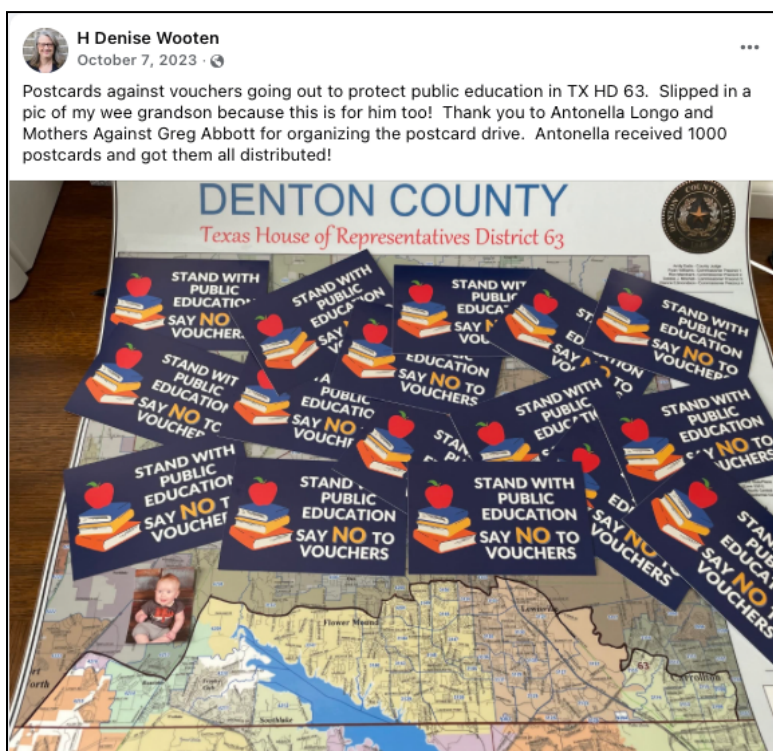

In an October 7, 2023 Facebook post, Wooten promoted a postcard campaign opposing school vouchers in Texas House District 63. Wooten said the postcards were “going out to protect public education” and thanked Mothers Against Greg Abbott and organizer Antonella Longo for coordinating the effort. The postcards featured the message, “Stand with Public Education. Say No to Vouchers.”¹⁴⁰

Wooten Called For The Immediate Repeal Of Texas’s School Voucher Program.

In a candidate questionnaire, Wooten called for the immediate repeal of Texas’s education savings account (ESA) school voucher program. She argued that eliminating the program would redirect up to \$1 billion in public funding from private schools back to Texas public schools and identified repeal of the voucher program as a legislative priority.¹⁴¹

Elections

Wooten Supports Expanding Voting Access And Criticized Conservative Efforts To Tighten Election Laws.

Wooten said in-person voting and voting by mail should be easy and accessible. She criticized what she described as “extremist conservative politicians” for making voting more difficult to discourage participation by voters who would not support them and pledged to fight for expanded voting access to strengthen democracy.¹⁴²

Wooten Encouraged Voters To Apply For Mail-In Ballots Ahead Of The 2022 Election.

In September 2022, Denise Wooten shared information explaining how voters could apply for a mail-in ballot before the October 24 deadline for the November election. She outlined eligibility requirements, provided links to download an application, track ballot status, and verify voter registration, and encouraged eligible voters to contact her with any questions.¹⁴³

Health Care

Wooten Called For A Texas Version Of The Affordable Care Act, More Medicaid Funding, And Restoring Planned Parenthood Funding.

In a candidate questionnaire, Wooten said Texas should make mental and medical health care more affordable by creating a state version of the Affordable Care Act that would provide subsidies, reform Medicaid to attract more providers, and restore funding to Planned Parenthood. She also called for expanding incentives to recruit and retain mental health and medical professionals.¹⁴⁴

LGBTQ+

Wooten Criticized Jeff Younger For Exploiting Transgender Children And Warned He Would Expand Policies Targeting The LGBTQ Community.

Wooten criticized Republican candidate Jeff Younger for exploiting transgender children to advance his political career and argued he should not be elected to the Texas House. Wooten characterized Younger as using misinformation about transgender youth to fuel his campaign and warned that, if elected, he would pursue policies extending beyond the transgender community. She argued her campaign would focus on countering what she described as misleading messaging about transgender issues and providing voters with more accurate information.¹⁴⁵

Wooten Promoted LGBTQ+ Rights, Including Support For Transgender Students And Anti-Discrimination Legislation.

In a September 9, 2022 Facebook post, Wooten said she would “fight for your human rights” and expressed support for the LGBTQ+ community. Wooten stated that she supported all members of the LGBTQ+ community, pledged to stand by transgender individuals facing prejudice in schools and harassment from the government, said she would support anti-discrimination legislation protecting LGBTQ+ individuals, and said she would listen to and learn from the LGBTQ+ community.¹⁴⁶

Gender Transition Procedures

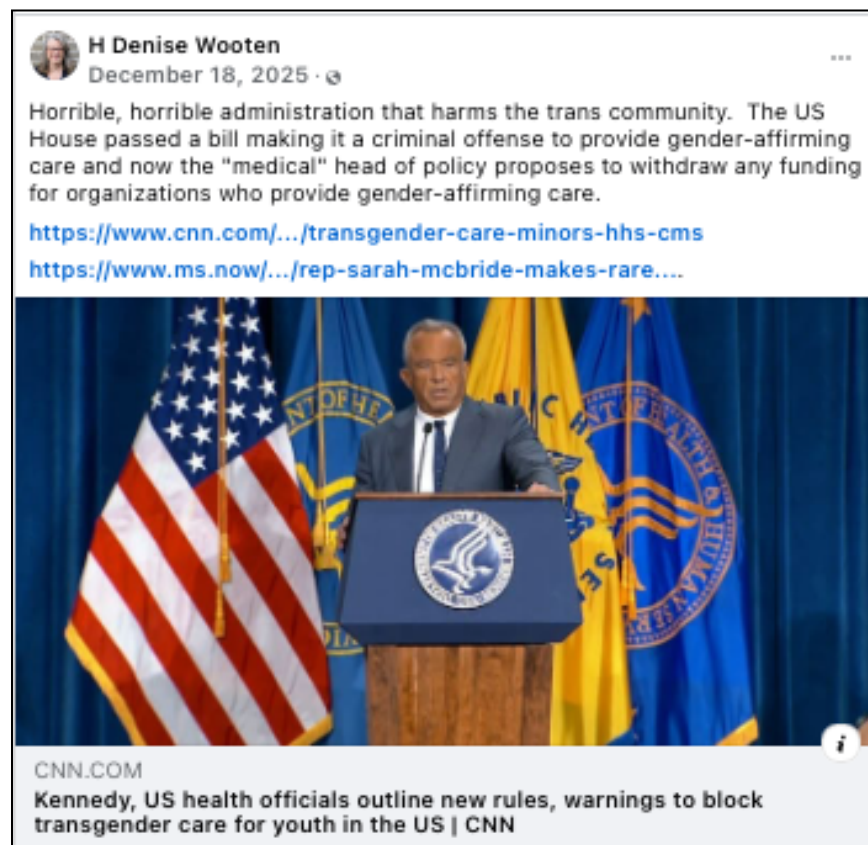
Wooten Opposes Government Restrictions On Gender Transition Procedures And Argues Decisions Should Be Left To Families And Medical Professionals.

In a March 2022 campaign blog post, Wooten argued that gender dysphoria is a legitimate mental health condition requiring evaluation and treatment by a multidisciplinary team of medical professionals. Wooten criticized efforts to investigate parents of transgender children or involve Child Protective Services in cases involving gender transition procedures, calling such actions “tragic” and arguing that failing to obtain psychological and medical care for children with gender dysphoria could increase the risk of depression and suicide. Wooten maintained that decisions regarding gender transition procedures should be made by patients, families, and medical professionals rather than government officials, politicians, religious groups, or Child

Protective Services, describing government intervention as an abuse of power and characterizing restrictions on the rights of transgender individuals as societal persecution.¹⁴⁷

Wooten Criticized Trump Administration Restrictions On Gender Transition Procedures For Minors And Opposed Criminal Penalties For Providers.

In December 2025, Wooten criticized the Trump administration's restrictions on gender transition procedures for minors, calling the policy "horrible." She wrote that the administration was harming transgender youth and also criticized a U.S. House bill that would have made providing gender transition procedures to minors a criminal offense and withdrawn federal funding from organizations that provide such care. Wooten shared news articles criticizing the administration's actions and expressed opposition to both the executive branch's policy and the House legislation.¹⁴⁸

Wooten Attended Local “No Kings” Protests And Called Them “What Democracy Looks Like.”

In June 2025, Wooten attended a local “No Kings” protest alongside her daughter and son-in-law. She shared photos and videos from the demonstrations and included the caption, “This is what democracy looks like,” expressing support for the anti-Trump protest movement.¹⁴⁹

In March 2026, Wooten attended another “No Kings” rally in Flower Mound and Carrollton, describing the event as having a “palpable” atmosphere. She posted a photo of herself holding a

No Kings Protests Are Funded By Far-Left Organizations And Liberal-Mega Donor George Soros, And Are Regularly Attended By Socialist And Communist Groups.

Driving the No Kings movement at the national level are prominent progressive organizations, including Indivisible, 50501, and MoveOn. Demonstrations are organized at the local level by

coalitions of hundreds of progressive groups that run the gamut from civil rights organizations to labor unions, religious communities, and nonprofits.¹⁵¹

The Open Society Foundations, founded by George Soros, has given \$7.61 million to Indivisible since 2018.¹⁵²

Members of the Freedom Road Socialist Organization, a Marxist group, raised their flag over the No Kings protest at the Minnesota State Capitol, alongside openly socialist and communist groups such as the Party for Socialism and Liberation, Freedom Road Socialist Organization.¹⁵³

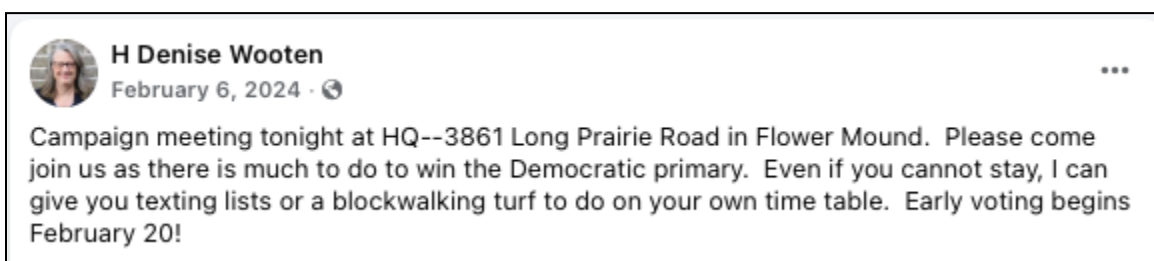
Private Practice

Wooten Received A Patient Complaint Via Google Reviews Alleging Campaign Activities, Pressure To Medicate A Child, And Unexpected Medical Bills.

A patient posted a negative review alleging that Dr. Wooten repeatedly prioritized political campaign activities over patient care by rescheduling appointments and cutting one visit short to attend political meetings. The reviewer claimed Wooten focused on discussing her Senate campaign during appointments, apparently meaning her Texas House campaign, diagnosed the reviewer's four-year-old child with ADHD, and pressured the family to pursue medication while offering few non-medication treatment options. The review also alleged the family was initially told testing would only require a co-pay but later received a bill exceeding \$800, despite assurances that insurance had been verified, leaving the reviewer feeling misled about both the care provided and the expected cost.¹⁵⁴

Wooten Appears To Run Her Campaign Out Of The Same Office As Her Private Practice.

In a February 2024 Facebook post, Wooten referred to a campaign meeting at "HQ," which listed the same 3861 Long Prairie Road address as her Psychology practice.^{155 156}

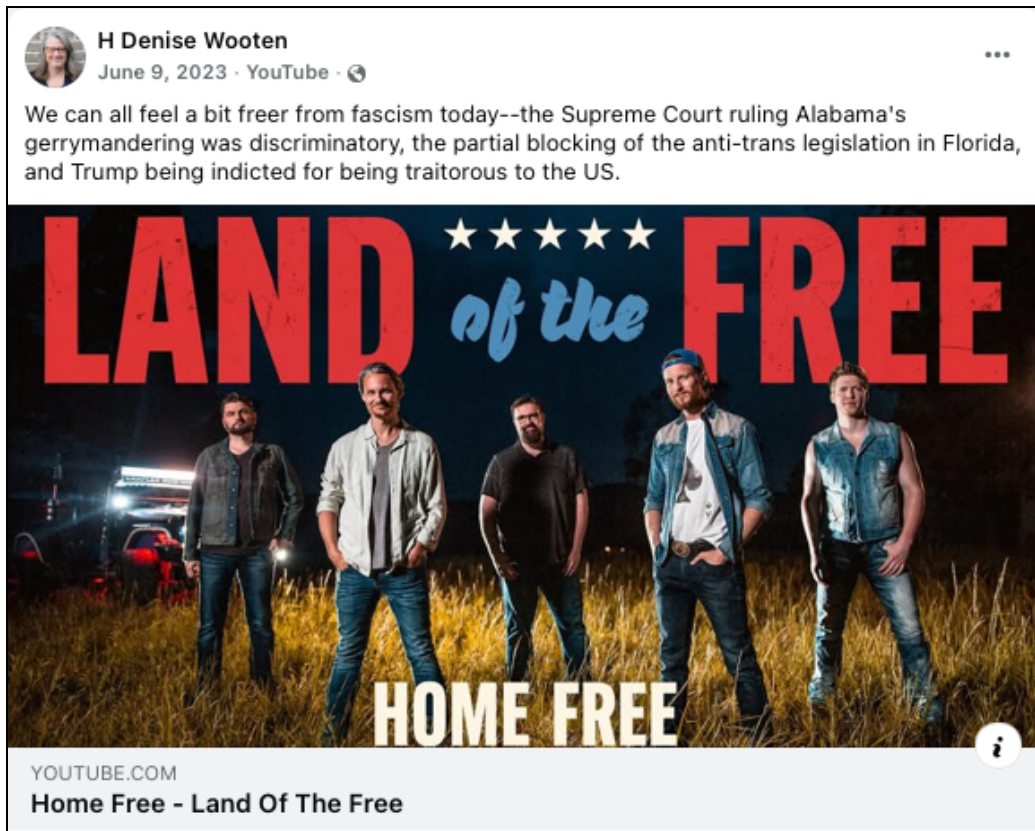

Right-Wing Criticism

Wooten Compared Contemporary Political Events To Fascism And Called Trump “Traitorous To The U.S.”

In a June 9, 2023 Facebook post, Wooten wrote that “we can all feel a bit freer from fascism today” following a series of political and legal developments. She cited the U.S. Supreme Court’s ruling on Alabama’s congressional map, a partial block of Florida’s anti-transgender legislation, and Donald Trump’s indictment, which she described as being “for being traitorous to the U.S.”¹⁵⁷

Second Amendment

Wooten Supports Excessive Gun Control Measures.

Wooten said she supported increasing the minimum age to purchase assault rifles, banning high-capacity magazines, and expanding gun safety measures.¹⁵⁸

Wooten Has Been Endorsed By Several Gun Control Advocacy Groups, Including Receiving The Gun Sense Voter Distinction And Being Named A Moms Demand Action Gun Sense Candidate.

Wooten received the “Gun Sense Voter” distinction from Everytown for Gun Safety, and was named a Moms Demand Action Gun Sense Candidate. Moms Demand Action is also tied to Everytown for Gun Safety. Everytown recommends the following solutions, among others: background checks on all gun sales, blocking a federal concealed carry mandate, prohibiting open carry, stopping arming teachers, gun dealer reform, prohibiting assault weapons, and similar policies.¹⁵⁹

Support From Radical Groups

Planned Parenthood Texas Votes

Wooten Is Endorsed by Planned Parenthood Texas Votes.

Wooten is endorsed by Planned Parenthood Texas Votes, which requires endorsed candidates to commit 100 percent to supporting abortion access.¹⁶⁰

Planned Parenthood Of Greater Texas Offers Gender Transition Hormone Therapy To Patients.

Planned Parenthood of Greater Texas provides sexual healthcare services to transgender, nonbinary, and gender-diverse individuals. The organization said it is committed to improving healthcare access for Texans, including by working to eliminate barriers to care.¹⁶¹

Nationally, Planned Parenthood has been found to be utilizing loopholes to provide gender transition services to minors via manipulating the definition of contraception.¹⁶²

Planned Parenthood Has Actively Participated In Efforts To Defund The Police.

Planned Parenthood Action Fund supported efforts to defund and divest from police departments, calling for governments to reduce police funding and redirect resources toward healthcare, education, housing, and other community-based public safety initiatives.¹⁶³

Texas Progressive Caucus

Wooten Is Endorsed By The Texas Progressive Caucus, A Far-Left Grassroots Organization Dedicated To Pushing The Democratic Party Further Left.

The Texas Progressive Caucus officially endorsed Wooten for HD-63 after she completed their endorsement questionnaire and was rated as “sufficiently progressive” by their endorsements committee. The organization describes itself as part of a “national movement to return New Deal politics to all levels of the Democratic Party,” with the stated goal of building progressive power to “break the GOP monopoly” in Texas.^{164 165}

The TXPC Has Demanded “No Compromise” On School Vouchers.

The TXPC has demanded “no compromise” on school vouchers and threatened Democratic lawmakers who even negotiate on the issue with primary challenges and blacklisting from party conventions.¹⁶⁶

TXPC Called On The Biden Administration To Impose A Ceasefire In The Middle East And Accused Israel Of War Crimes.

The organization also called on the Biden Administration to impose a ceasefire in the Middle East, accused Israel of maintaining “open-air prisons” and practicing “apartheid,” and called the killing of innocents a “war crime as defined by the Geneva Convention.”¹⁶⁷

The TXPC Works Alongside The Texas Legislative Progressive Caucus, Whose Legislative Platform Supports A Number Of Radical Positions.

The TXPC works in coalition with its “sister organization,” the Texas Legislative Progressive Caucus, whose 89th Legislature platform calls for legalizing cannabis, repealing right-to-work laws, mandating collective bargaining, expanding Medicaid, and creating a new tax on the crypto and AI industries.¹⁶⁸

Wooten Contributed To Amy Klobuchar's Presidential Campaign, One Of The Most Liberal Members Of The U.S. Senate.

FEC records show Wooten contributed to Amy Klobuchar's 2020 presidential campaign.¹⁶⁹

Klobuchar Is One Of The Senate's Most Liberal Members.

Klobuchar has never received a rating lower than 85% from the Americans for Democratic Action and scored 100% in three years, making her one of the Senate's most liberal members.¹⁷⁰

Klobuchar Is Pro-Choice And Supports Taxpayer Funding Of Planned Parenthood.

Klobuchar is pro-choice and a vocal supporter of Planned Parenthood, standing by the organization and its funding and campaigning on her support for both Roe v. Wade and Planned Parenthood.^{171 172}

Klobuchar Has Called Herself A “Proven Progressive.”

At a 2020 town hall, Klobuchar said, “Progressives should support me because I'm a proven progressive.”¹⁷³

Collin Allred

Wooten Contributed To Colin Allred's U.S. Senate Campaign.

FEC records show Wooten contributed to Colin Allred's 2024 U.S. Senate campaign against Ted Cruz.¹⁷⁴

Allred Voted Against The Protection of Women And Girls In Sports Act.

As a U.S. Representative, Allred voted against the Protection of Women and Girls in Sports Act, which would have banned biological males from competing in women's sports.^{175 176 177}

Allred Cosponsored The Equality Act, And Cosponsored A Transgender Bill Of Rights.

He cosponsored the Equality Act, which would allow individuals to use the restroom of their choice, and cosponsored a resolution calling for a “Transgender Bill of Rights” that would guarantee biological men the right to participate in women’s sports.^{178 179 180}

Allred Called For The Abolishment Of ICE.

Allred has also called to “abolish ICE,” stating “I think we should get rid of ICE, abolish ICE, whatever you want to call it,” and pledged to “stop ICE, end the mass raids and make sure every ICE agent who breaks the law is prosecuted.”¹⁸¹

Ruben Gallego

Wooten Contributed To Ruben Gallego’s Arizona Senate Campaign.

FEC records show Wooten contributed to Ruben Gallego's 2024 Arizona Senate campaign.¹⁸²

Gallego Was A Member Of The Congressional Progressive Caucus.

Gallego was a member of the Congressional Progressive Caucus, which is a coalition that advocates for progressive policy priorities, including universal health care, comprehensive immigration reform, climate action, debt-free college, higher wages, expanded labor protections, and a more progressive foreign policy. The caucus also supports expanding the federal government’s role in addressing economic inequality, healthcare, labor, and environmental issues.^{183 184}

Gallego Was Accused Of Having Sexual Relationships With Multiple House Staffers.

In July 2026, three sources told the New York Post that Gallego had sexual relationships with two House staffers working for Democratic colleagues, including one woman in her 20s.^{185 186}

Gallego Is Described As A Close Friend Of Disgraced Former Rep. Eric Swalwell.

Gallego is also a close personal friend of disgraced former Rep. Eric Swalwell, who resigned from Congress in April 2026 after at least four women accused him of sexual misconduct, including a former staffer who alleged sexual assault.^{187 188}

Trump

Wooten Said She Had “No Respect” For Anyone Who Voted For Trump While Criticizing His Economic Policies.

In February 2025, Wooten wrote that she had “NO RESPECT for anyone who voted for Trump--NONE” while criticizing his economic policies. Sharing a video about Canada’s response to Trump’s trade policies, Wooten argued that Trump’s policies would hurt his supporters the most and wrote that if they did not care about “all the vulnerable people he would hurt,” they “should have cared at least for their own pocketbooks.”¹⁸⁹

Wooten Referred To Trump Supporters As “Trump’s Cult.”

In an August 1, 2023 Facebook post about Donald Trump’s federal indictment, Wooten wrote that the evidence against Trump was “compelling” and said she wished “Trump’s cult would logically examine the facts, but I doubt it.” The post shared a YouTube video discussing Trump’s indictment on four criminal counts.¹⁹⁰

RESEARCH METHODOLOGY

Court Case Search: A search was conducted via the PACER Case Locator to identify court cases associated with Wooten.

Federal Election Commission: An analysis of federal contribution history from Wooten.

Fulcrum Intel Social Media Vetting Report: A ten-year social media vetting report was conducted on Wooten. The system analyzes 21 different risk factors, including but not limited to violent images, language, narcotics, alcohol, and specific keywords.

Intelius Background Report: A report was conducted on Wooten, reviewing data from these searches, including but not limited to: Social Media Accounts, Dark Web Data Leaks, Business Records, Vehicle Ownership, Property Records, Tax Liens, Foreclosures, Criminal and Civil Court Records, Judgments, Licenses, Phone Numbers, Emails, etc.

IRBsearch Comprehensive Background Report: This report, conducted on Wooten, gives an overview of every available public record in a person's adult history, including but not limited to contact information, criminal and civil history, judgments, liens, and vehicle ownership.

L2 VoterMapping: A search and review of Wooten's relevant voting records and patterns was conducted.

LexisNexis Public Records Search: The items reviewed from these searches included but not limited to: property records, tax liens, foreclosures, criminal and civil court records, judgments, licenses, phone numbers, emails, etc.

Multimedia: A search for radio, television, and video content related to Wooten was conducted.

Pimeyes: A reverse image search on Wooten was conducted.

SkopeNow Comprehensive Background Report: A report was conducted on Wooten, reviewing data from these searches including but not limited to: social media accounts, dark web data leaks, business records, vehicle ownership, property records, tax liens, foreclosures, criminal and civil court records, judgments, licenses, phone numbers, emails, etc.

Texas Court Records (re:SearchTX): A statewide search was made for all court records pertaining to Wooten in every Texas county.

Texas Ethics Commission: A search for campaign filings and contributions was conducted for Wooten.

Texas Behavioral Health Executive Council License Search: A search for Wooten's license, along with any complaints and/or sanctions was conducted.
