granting organization (SGO).

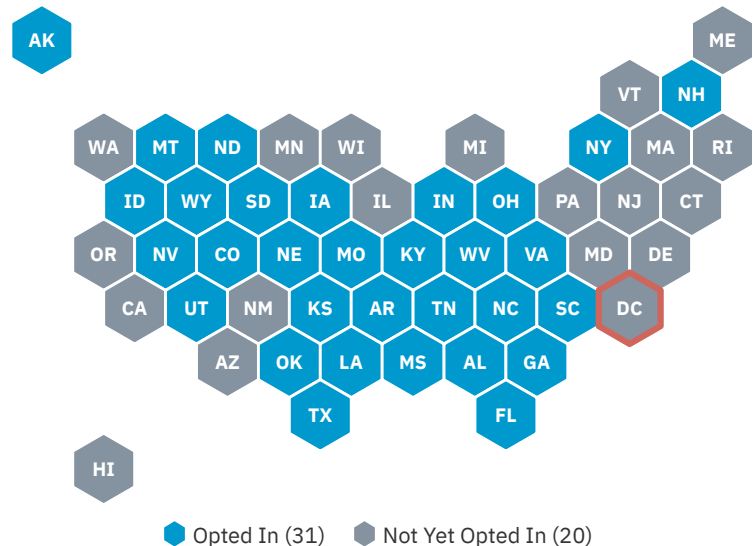
DONOR CLAIMS THE CREDIT

At filing, the donor claims the
dollar-for-dollar federal credit.

D.C. BY THE NUMBERS

- **77,669 D.C. students are eligible** for EFTC scholarships.
- **D.C. has not yet opted in.** Its 77,669 eligible students can receive scholarships only if the District opts in.
- **The EFTC builds on an existing option.** D.C. families currently have the federally funded Opportunity Scholarship Program; the Education Freedom Tax Credit would layer on a new stream of scholarship support at no cost to the District's budget.
- **Most families qualify.** The income limit is 300% of area median income, which averages about \$498,000 for a family of four in D.C.
- **Students in public, private, and charter schools are eligible.**

WHICH STATES HAVE OPTED IN



SCHOLARSHIP DOLLARS FOR D.C. STUDENTS

If D.C. taxpayers with \$1,700 of tax liability redirect the full credit to an SGO, the dollars add up fast:

\$23.2 million

in scholarships every year if **10%** of taxpayers with \$1,700
of tax liability participate

\$69.6 million

in scholarships every year if **30%** of taxpayers with \$1,700
of tax liability participate
