Introduction

On July 21, 2026, the Fulcrum Intel research team began an assessment of Jordan Wheatley’s personal, professional, and political history. This report outlines the results of our research and provides an analysis of the resulting information relating to Wheatley and his vulnerabilities as a candidate for Texas State Representative District 67. Executive Summary

Jordan Wheatley is a 28-year-old public-school teacher who moved from West Virginia to Texas in May 2021. His relatively recent arrival in the state and limited voting and public-service history highlight his political inexperience and lack of deep roots in the district. Wheatley first sought office in 2025 as a Democratic candidate for Texas’s 3rd Congressional District but suspended that campaign before the primary after raising only slightly more than \$18,000, citing the financial barriers facing working-class candidates. He subsequently filed for Texas House District 67 and won the 2026 Democratic primary.

Politically, Wheatley presents himself as an affordability-focused progressive who supports making housing, healthcare, and higher education more accessible. As a teacher, he places public education at the center of his campaign, calling Texas’s private-school voucher program a “scam” and arguing that it is part of a Republican effort to privatize education and divert resources from classrooms, teachers and lower-income students. Wheatley also strongly opposes Republican-led redistricting, which he has described as election “rigging,” and accused Texas Republicans of prioritizing partisan maps over assistance for victims of the July 2025 Central Texas floods.

Wheatley has made his identity as a member of the LGBTQ+ community a visible part of his campaign and has pledged to work with Equality Texas. He received the LGBTQ+ Victory Fund's endorsement and credited the affiliated Victory Institute with helping train candidates like himself. During his congressional campaign, his committee used campaign funds to pay for Victory Institute candidate training covering fundraising, messaging, media, and campaign strategy. These relationships connect Wheatley to organizations that support progressive positions on gender transitions, transgender participation in school sports, restroom access based on gender identity, and expanded LGBTQ-related instruction and protections.

TOP FINDINGS

Not A Texan

1. Originally from West Virginia, Wheatley only moved to Texas in early May 2021, yet he calls on voters to “take back this state” and says he wants to “make Texas blue.”^{1 2 3 4 5}
 - a. Wheatley did not register to vote in Texas until January 12, 2022.^{6 7}

Progressive LGBTQ Agenda

1. Wheatley has publicly identified himself as a member of the LGBTQ community and made LGBTQ+ representation a central part of his political identity.⁸
 - a. In a Pride message, Wheatley called for removing anti-LGBTQ politicians from office and urged members of the community to seek positions of leadership.⁹
2. Wheatley was endorsed by the LGBTQ+ Victory Fund and said he would work with Equality Texas if elected.^{10 11}
 - a. Equality Texas supports gender-transition procedures for children, having opposed Texas legislation that prohibited puberty suppression, hormone replacement, and gender surgeries for children. They also support male participation in women’s sports, restroom access based on gender identity, and policies allowing schools to withhold a student’s chosen name or pronouns from parents.^{12 13 14 15 16 17}

- b. The LGBTQ+ Victory Institute has promoted “trans refuge” laws, gender transition procedures for children, and proposals calling for repeal of the Hyde Amendment and expanded taxpayer support for abortion.^{18 19 20 21 22}
 - i. The organization has also opposed religious exemptions that allow healthcare workers or businesses to refuse certain services on moral or religious grounds.^{23 24}
 3. When running for Texas Congressional District 3, Wheatley used committee campaign funds to pay for candidate training through the Victory Institute.²⁵
 - a. The LGBTQ Victory Institute describes its Candidate & Campaign Training as a bootcamp-style, nonpartisan simulation for current and prospective LGBTQ candidates, campaign staff, and community leaders, using realistic exercises to help participants develop plans to run for office and win.²⁶

Support For Progressive Policies

1. Wheatley backs a health insurance public option.^{27 28}
 - a. A public option has been pushed by Democrats as a way to transition to a single-payer healthcare system.²⁹
2. Wheatley reposted a post from Kamala Harris supporting DACA recipients.³⁰
3. Wheatley supports a path to citizenship for illegal immigrants.³¹
4. Wheatley supports expanding Texas’s medical marijuana program and moving toward a regulated recreational market.³²

Support For Progressives

1. In 2020, Wheatley made three separate contributions to Pete Buttigieg’s presidential campaign.³³
 - a. Buttigieg backed the Equality Act, opposed restrictions on transgender military service and women’s sports, supported expanding abortion access and repealing the Hyde Amendment’s limits on federal abortion funding, and proposed a government-run health-insurance option that he described as a path toward Medicare for All.^{34 35}
 - b. Buttigieg has also supported an assault-weapons ban, universal background checks, red-flag laws and restrictions on high-capacity magazines.^{36 37}
2. Wheatley has reshared posts supporting James Talarico on his campaign’s Instagram.³⁸
 - a. Talarico has embraced a strongly progressive agenda. His campaign calls for federal legislation codifying *Roe v. Wade*, protecting same-sex marriage and LGBTQ rights, and legalizing recreational marijuana, and he has consistently opposed private-school vouchers and restrictions on books in public schools.^{39 40}
 - b. Talarico has also drawn controversy for provocative statements on religion, race and gender, including saying that “God is nonbinary,” and describing radicalized white men as the country’s greatest domestic-terrorism threat.^{41 42 43 44}

Inexperienced Political Novice

1. Wheatley is a first-time candidate who has never previously run for or held elected office prior to the 2026 election.⁴⁵
2. Wheatley suspended his first campaign, a bid for the Democratic nomination in Texas’ 3rd Congressional District, in August 2025, before the 2026 primary.⁴⁶

- a. At the time he withdrew from the congressional race, his campaign had reported raising only a little more than \$18,000.⁴⁷
3. On December 8, 2025, Wheatley filed to run for Texas State Representative for District 67.^{48 49}

Against School Choice

1. Wheatley strongly opposes school vouchers and other “school choice” programs that direct public funding toward private schools.⁵⁰
 - a. Wheatley characterized Texas’s private-school voucher law as a “voucher scam” and part of a broader Republican effort to privatize education.⁵¹

Opposed Texas Redistricting

1. Wheatley strongly opposed Texas’s redistricting effort and testified against it, calling the process “rigging” rather than legitimate redistricting.⁵²
 - a. Wheatley accused Republican lawmakers of drawing maps that silence communities of color.⁵³
2. Wheatley praised the Texas Democratic legislators who left the state to block the Republican-backed redistricting effort, arguing that their decision required significant courage and personal sacrifice.⁵⁴
 - a. Wheatley said their willingness to accept those risks showed “courage” and that they were putting Texans and their constituents ahead of their own political interests.⁵⁵

Online Conduct

1. In 2013, Wheatley called someone a “fat ass” and made fun of their weight in a social media post.⁵⁶

Biography

"The son of a coal miner and a school bus driver, Jordan learned early on that working hard and following the rules is no guarantee when the system is rigged for the wealthy few and the politicians they keep in their pockets. He grew up watching that system eat alive his parents, his friends, and his hometown.

Now, from the front of a public school classroom, he sees that this isn't just his story. It's the story of a majority of us being told to chase an 'American Dream' while a system built on greed decides our children's futures before they've even graduated, guaranteeing a life of struggle to ensure the profit stays with the powerful and the few while the people doing the work are left behind. Jordan doesn't have a "political origin story." He has a life of showing up when the sun is still down and no one is watching.

Before he was a teacher, he was the high school kid on the midnight newspaper route. When his father lost his job, Jordan was the one on the gravel lot helping run the family car business. He was the student in Brazil learning from children with disabilities what it really means to never give up and he was the therapist who understood that finding your voice is the ultimate act of independence, especially for children with autism.

Throughout his life he has dedicated himself to giving kids the tools to speak for themselves in a world that often tries to speak for them.

That's why today, you'll find him in a 4th-grade classroom in South Dallas or on the court as an elementary basketball coach, where he sees our future in his students' and players eyes. He sees the brilliance that each of his them bring to this world, but he also sees the walls being built around them.

Jordan isn't running to be a politician; he's running because he's a teacher who refuses to watch a rigged system steal his students' potential before they even pick up a pencil. He's seen the walls being built around them, and he's going to Austin to tear them down! The fire Jordan carries was lit long ago in the hills of Madison, West Virginia. The son of a coal miner and a school bus driver, he saw firsthand that "working hard" is a empty promise when the wealthy few and the politicians they keep in their pockets are the ones holding the pen to our futures.

Life demanded a lot from Jordan early on. At fifteen, he became his grandmother's primary caregiver, and hospital rooms became his second home. It was there, doing homework by her bedside or studying for college exams while painting her fingernails, that he learned the most

Education

Anti-School Choice

Wheatley Is Strongly Against Vouchers And School Choice.

Wheatley opposes school vouchers and other school-choice programs that direct public funding toward private schools. He argues that voucher programs weaken traditional public schools by diverting money from classrooms that are already underfunded and struggling to meet students' needs.¹⁰⁸

Wheatley makes public education a central campaign priority. He says the state should instead invest more in classrooms, teacher compensation, students, and retired educators, while criticizing Gov. Greg Abbott, Rep. Jeff Leach, and their supporters for prioritizing private education and corporate interests.^{109 110 111}

Wheatley Called Vouchers A Scam And A Republican Attempt To Privatize Education.

Wheatley characterizes Texas's private-school voucher law as a "voucher scam" that takes funding away from public schools and redirects it toward private education. He argues that vouchers are part of a broader Republican effort to privatize education at both the state and federal levels, leaving public-school students and lower-income families to bear the consequences.¹¹²

Critical Race Theory

Wheatley Calls Critical Race Theory Concerns "Insane" While Opposing Classroom Book Restrictions.

Wheatley dismisses concerns about critical race theory in public schools as "insane," arguing that lawmakers use the issue to impose unnecessary restrictions on teachers and classroom materials. He criticized rules requiring him to review every book in his classroom library according to standards set by politicians.¹¹³

Healthcare

Public Option

Wheatley Supports A Public Option, Which Is A Stepping Stone Toward Single-Payer.

Wheatley supports creating a public health insurance option.^{114 115}

Democrats have previously pushed for a public option as a stepping stone toward a single-payer system.¹¹⁶

Medicaid Expansion

Wheatley Believes Texas Should Expand Medicaid Eligibility.

Wheatley supports expanding Medicaid in Texas. He argues that the state's refusal to accept available federal funding leaves families facing overwhelming medical expenses while Texas tax dollars support health-care systems in other states. Wheatley believes that Medicaid expansion would bring billions of federal dollars back to Texas, reduce the number of uninsured residents, and help families obtain necessary medical care without risking bankruptcy.¹¹⁷

Expanding Medical Marijuana

Wheatley Supports Expanding Texas's Medical Marijuana Program.

Wheatley supports expanding Texas's medical marijuana program and moving toward a regulated recreational market. He argues that the state's current approach has failed, particularly for veterans seeking medical relief and people whose lives are disrupted by low-level possession charges. Wheatley also contends that legalization could generate significant tax revenue for schools, roads, and other public priorities while allowing local governments to focus law-enforcement resources on violent crime. He has proposed putting marijuana legalization before Texas voters through a constitutional amendment in November 2027.¹¹⁸

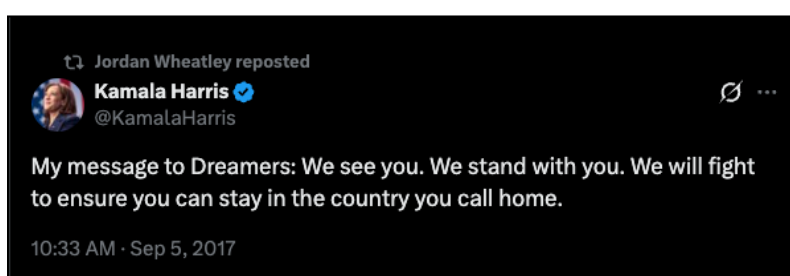

DACA

Wheatley Reposted A Post From Kamala Harris Showing Her Support For DACA Recipients.

In 2017, Wheatley reposted a post from Kamala Harris in support of DACA recipients, saying:

“My message to Dreamers: We see you. We stand with you. We will fight to ensure you can stay in the country you call home.”¹¹⁹

DACA Is A Federal Policy That Protects Illegal Immigrants Brought Into The United States As Children.

Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals, or DACA, is a federal policy created in 2012 that allows certain undocumented immigrants who came to the United States as children to receive temporary protection from deportation and apply for work authorization.¹²⁰

DACA recipients are commonly called “Dreamers” after the proposed Development, Relief, and Education for Alien Minors, or DREAM, Act, which sought to provide legal status to qualifying young immigrants.¹²¹

Path To Citizenship

Wheatley Supports A Path To Citizenship For Illegal Immigrants.

In a candidate interview, Wheatley stated that he supported creating a clear path to citizenship for immigrants, arguing that immigrants strengthen American communities and contribute to the economy.¹²²

Political Novice

Wheatley Ended His First Campaign For Texas Congressional District 3 Before The 2026 Primary.

Wheatley ended his first campaign for public office in August 2025, suspending his bid for the Democratic nomination in Texas' 3rd Congressional District before the 2026 primary.¹²³

Wheatley said the decision was difficult and pointed to the financial barriers facing working-class candidates competing against established political organizations. At the time, his campaign had reported raising only a little more than \$18,000. Although he withdrew from the congressional race, Wheatley said he intended to remain active as a teacher, advocate, and volunteer in Collin County.¹²⁴

On December 8, 2025, Wheatley filed to run for Texas State Representative for District 67.^{125 126}

Wheatley Was Endorsed By Liz Michel, Who He Paid A Salary For During His Congressional Campaign.

Liz Michel, who has endorsed Wheatley's current campaign, previously had a paid financial relationship with him. Federal Election Commission filings from Wheatley's congressional campaign show that his campaign committee made salary payments to Michel for campaign work.^{127 128}

Immature

Wheatley Campaign Hosted A Love Island Watch Party As A Voter Outreach Event.

Wheatley's campaign organized a *Love Island* watch party in McKinney as an unconventional campaign event aimed at attracting supporters through the popular reality show rather than a traditional political forum.¹²⁹

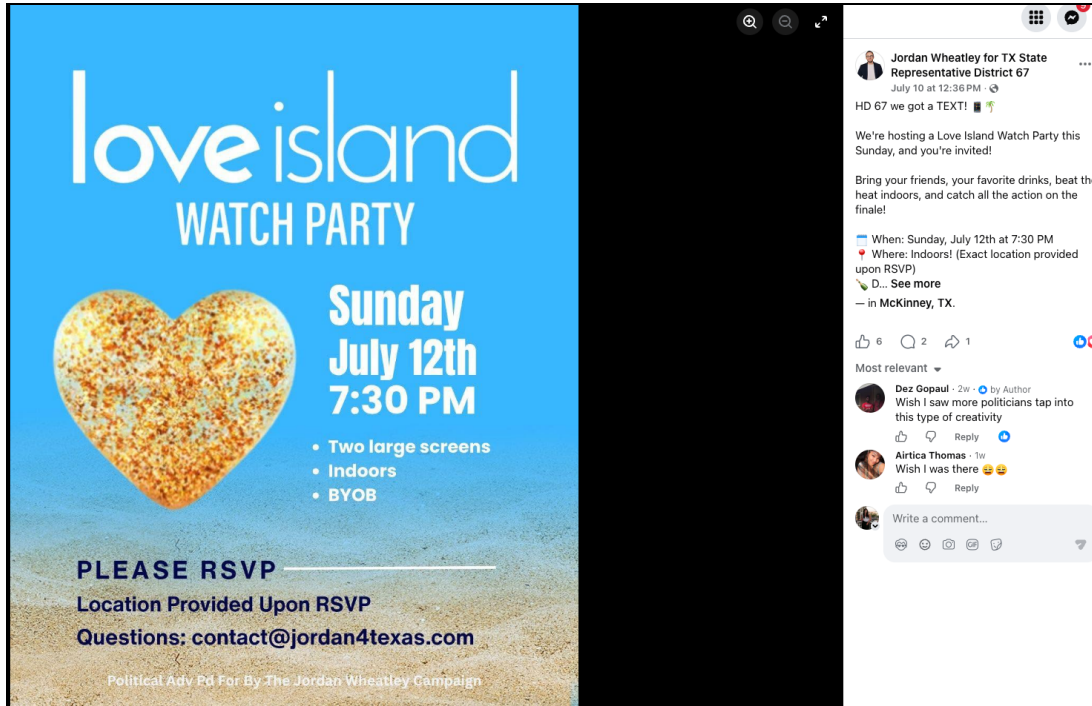

Wheatley has publicly identified himself as a member of the LGBTQ community and made LGBTQ representation a visible part of his political identity. In a Pride message, Wheatley

Equality Texas Supports A Progressive Agenda Like Gender Transition Procedures For Minors.

Equality Texas supports a progressive agenda, including access to gender transition procedures for minors, allowing transgender students to compete in school sports and use bathrooms consistent with their “gender identity,” and permitting schools to respect a student’s chosen name or pronouns without automatically disclosing that information to parents.^{134 135 136} The organization also advocates allowing transgender people to change their names and gender markers on government identification, expanding LGBTQ-themed books and lessons in public schools, and adopting comprehensive nondiscrimination rules covering employment, housing, healthcare, businesses, and public accommodations.^{137 138}

Wheatley Was Endorsed By The Victory Fund, The Political Action Committee Of The Victory Institute.

LGBTQ Victory Fund is a national political organization dedicated to increasing LGBTQ representation in government. The group recruits, endorses and financially supports openly LGBTQ candidates who are “pro-equality, pro-choice and considered capable of running viable campaigns for local, state and federal office.” The group acts as the PAC to its sister organization, The Victory Institute.¹³⁹

The LGBTQ Victory Institute Promotes Controversial Policies on Gender, Girls’ Sports, Religious Liberty, and Abortion Funding

The LGBTQ Victory Institute has promoted several progressive policies, including “trans refuge” laws that shield minors, parents, and providers from penalties related to gender-transition care; access to gender transition procedures for children; transgender participation in girls’ sports; and restroom access based on gender identity rather than biological sex.^{140 141 142 143} The organization has also opposed broad religious exemptions that allow healthcare workers or businesses to refuse certain services on moral or religious grounds.¹⁴⁴ In addition, policy proposals elevated through its fellowship programs have called for repealing the Hyde Amendment, expanding taxpayer-supported reproductive services, and protecting access to gender-transition procedures.¹⁴⁵

Wheatley Used Campaign Funds To Pay For Leadership Training Through The Victory Institute.

When running for Texas Congressional District 3, Wheatley used committee campaign funds to pay for “candidate training” through the Victory Institute.¹⁴⁶

The LGBTQ Victory Institute describes its Candidate & Campaign Training as a bootcamp-style, nonpartisan simulation for current and prospective LGBTQ candidates, campaign staff, and community leaders, using realistic exercises to help participants develop plans to run for office

and win.¹⁴⁷

Its curriculum teaches fundraising strategies such as building prospect lists and reliable donor bases, message development, press management, and broader campaign strategy.¹⁴⁸

Pete Buttigieg

Wheatley Contributed To Pete Buttigieg’s Presidential Campaign.

In 2020, Wheatley made three separate contributions to Pete Buttigieg’s presidential campaign.¹⁴⁹

Pete Buttigieg Supported Progressive Policies On LGBTQ Rights, Abortion, Healthcare, Guns, And Climate.

Pete Buttigieg, an openly gay Democrat, has supported a range of progressive policies. He backed the Equality Act, opposed restrictions on transgender military service, supported expanding abortion access and repealing the Hyde Amendment’s limits on federal abortion funding, and proposed a government-run health-insurance option that he described as a path toward Medicare for All.¹⁵⁰

Buttigieg has also supported an assault-weapons ban, universal background checks, red-flag laws and restrictions on high-capacity magazines, while calling for the United States to rejoin the Paris climate agreement and pursue net-zero emissions by 2050.^{151 152}

Outsider

Not A Texan

Wheatley Calls On Voters To “Take Back This [Texas] State,” Despite Only Moving To Texas In 2021.

Originally from West Virginia, Wheatley moved to Texas in early May 2021.^{153 154 155}

Despite only living in the state for five years, Wheatley calls on voters to “take back this [Texas] state” and wants to “make Texas blue.”^{156 157}

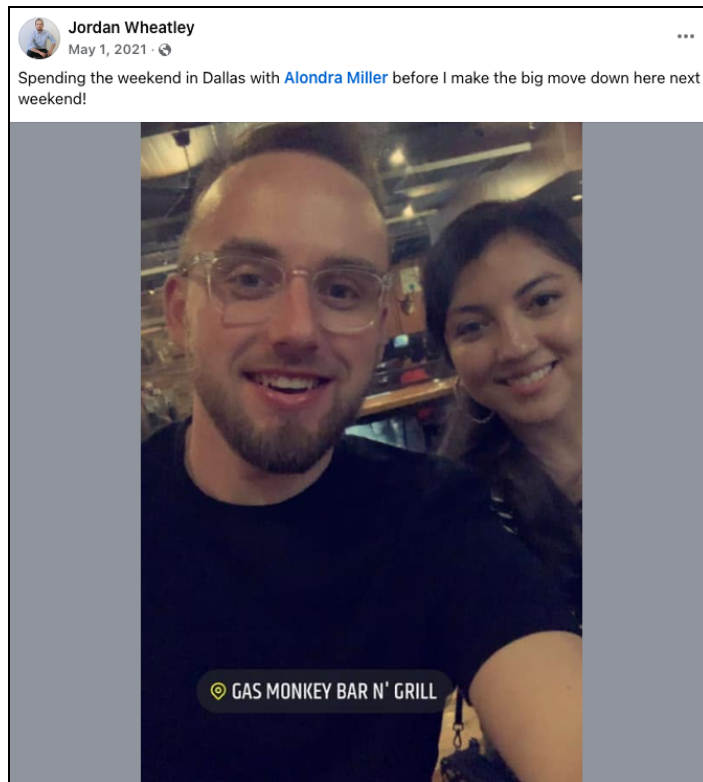

Redistricting

Wheatley Opposed Texas’s Redistricting And Testified Against It.

Wheatley strongly opposed Texas’s redistricting approach, arguing that it is designed to preserve Republican political power rather than ensure fair representation. He contends that Black, Latino, and working-class communities are being divided, packed, or otherwise weakened through district lines that reduce their electoral influence. Wheatley characterized the process as “rigging” rather than legitimate redistricting and accused Republican lawmakers of drawing maps that silence communities of color instead of reflecting the state’s population growth. He also argued that these maps have consequences beyond elections, saying they left working families and communities like those he teaches ignored by their representatives.¹⁵⁸

Wheatley Accused Texas Republicans Of Prioritizing Redistricting Over The Texas Flood Victims.

Wheatley accused Texas Republicans of prioritizing partisan redistricting over assistance for communities devastated by flooding in central Texas in July 2025.^{159 160}

He argued that lawmakers were focused on securing additional Republican congressional seats and “rigging elections” instead of passing urgently needed flood-relief legislation for Texans who had lost homes and loved ones. Wheatley praised Texas Democrats for resisting the redistricting effort and said the state’s immediate priority should be helping flood victims, including students returning to school without homes, rather than pursuing political maps that he believes primarily serve Governor Greg Abbott and Donald Trump.¹⁶¹

Wheatley Praises Texas Democrats For Leaving The State To Block Republican Redistricting And Said They Showed “Courage.”

Wheatley praised the Texas Democratic legislators who left the state to block the Republican-backed redistricting effort, arguing that their decision required significant courage and personal sacrifice. He noted that the lawmakers faced fines of \$500 per day, possible consequences for their staff, and the loss of valuable campaign time. Wheatley said their willingness to accept those risks showed “courage” and that they were putting Texans and their constituents ahead of their own political interests. He described the lawmakers as being in good spirits, urged supporters to help them financially, and “doing right unlike Republicans.”¹⁶²

Support For Progressives

James Talarico

Wheatley Has Reshared Posts Of James Talarico, Signaling He Supports His Senate Run.

Wheatley has reshared posts from and about James Talarico on his campaign’s Instagram, signaling he supports Talarico and his run for U.S. Senate.¹⁶³

Talarico Supports A Progressive Agenda And Stated God Was “Nonbinary.”

Talarico has embraced a strongly progressive agenda. His campaign calls for federal legislation codifying *Roe v. Wade*, protecting same-sex marriage and LGBTQ rights, and legalizing recreational marijuana, while he has consistently opposed private-school vouchers and restrictions on books in public schools.^{164 165}

Talarico has also drawn controversy for provocative statements on religion, race and gender, including saying that “God is nonbinary,” describing radicalized white men as the country’s

greatest domestic-terrorism threat and promoting the addition of pronouns to his legislative staff's business cards as a message of support for transgender Texans.^{166 167 168 169}

Ethics

Wheatley Appears To Have Conducted A Political Interview From His Classroom Where He Teaches.

In August 2025, Wheatley appears to have conducted an interview with a YouTuber in which he touted his campaign from his classroom. Wheatley notes that his school day just ended and that he threw on a blazer that he keeps in his room.¹⁷⁰

Editor's Note: *In the interview linked above, Wheatley appears to be taking it from his classroom. According to the Texas Association of School Boards, employees are prohibited from using district resources to promote a partisan political candidate.*¹⁷¹

RESEARCH METHODOLOGY

Collin County Court: A search of court records pertaining to Wheatley was conducted and reviewed.

Collin County Assessor's Office: A search for properties associated with Wheatley was conducted and reviewed.

Collin County Treasurer-Tax Collector: A search of relevant information regarding Wheatley's tax history was conducted.

Federal Election Commission: A search for contributions made by Wheatley was conducted.

Fulcrum Intel Social Media Vetting Report: A ten-year social media vetting report was conducted on Wheatley. The system analyzes 21 different risk factors, including but not limited to violent images, language, narcotics, alcohol, and specific keywords.

Intelius Comprehensive Background Report: A report was conducted reviewing data on Wheatley from these searches, including but not limited to: Property Records, Tax Liens, Foreclosures, Criminal and Civil Court Records, Judgments, Licenses, Phone Numbers, Emails, etc.

IRBsearch Comprehensive Background Report: This report, conducted on Wheatley, provides an overview of all available public records in a person's adult history, including, but not limited to, contact information, criminal and civil history, judgments, liens, and vehicle ownership.

LexisNexis Public Records Search: The items reviewed from these searches included, but were not limited to: Property Records, Tax Liens, Foreclosures, Criminal and Civil Court Records, Judgments, Licenses, Phone Numbers, Emails, etc.

L2 Data Mapping: A search of Wheatley's relevant voting records and patterns was conducted.

Multimedia: A search for radio, television, and video content related to Wheatley was conducted and thoroughly reviewed.

PACER: A search for court records involving Wheatley was conducted.

PimEyes: A reverse image search on Wheatley was conducted.

ProPublica: A search of PPP Loans to any of Wheatley's associated companies was conducted.

Search Engine Searches: A search of relevant information on Wheatley and his public comments and positions was conducted.

SkopeNow Comprehensive Background Report: A report was conducted on Wheatley, reviewing data from these searches, including but not limited to: Social Media Accounts, Dark Web Data Leaks, Business Records, Vehicle Ownership, Property Records, Tax Liens, Foreclosures, Criminal and Civil Court Records, Judgments, Licenses, Phone Numbers, Emails, etc.

Texas Secretary of State Campaign Finance Power Search: A search was conducted of Wheatley's campaign finance contributions.

Texas Secretary of State Direct Business Search Online: A search was conducted of relevant business records pertaining to Wheatley.
